



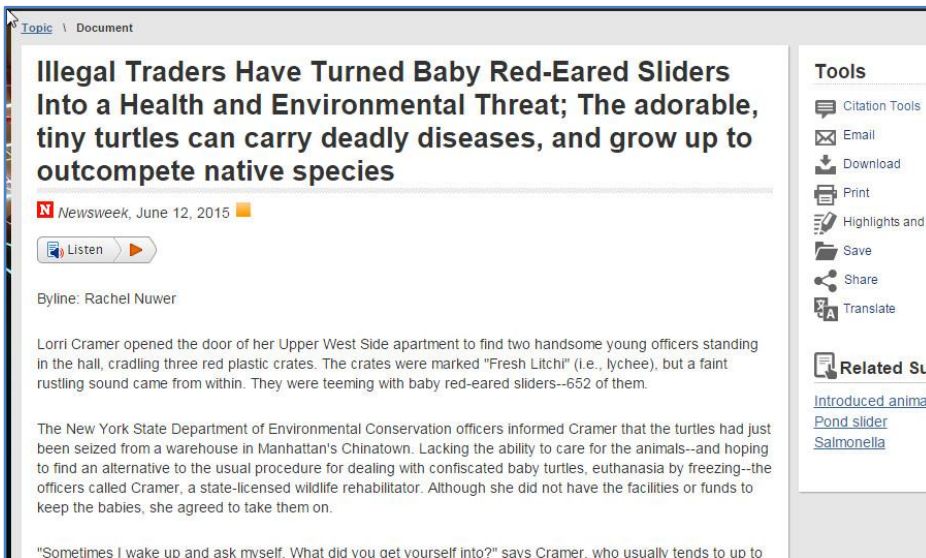
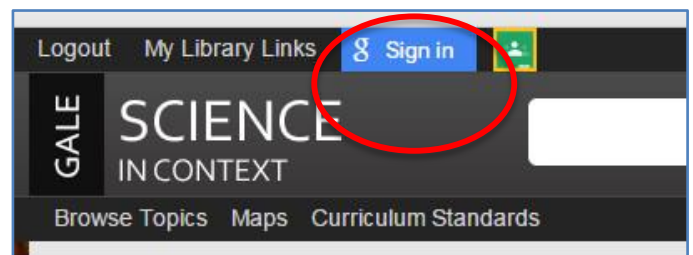
## Gale to Google Path: Share to Google Classroom Integration Tip Sheet

Gale is excited to offer **Gale to Google Path** in our *In Context* resources. You'll be able to take advantage of a seamless user login with your Google Classroom account and easily share and download content with students. This tip sheet will demonstrate how to create classroom assignments or announcements using digital content from Gale resources. This feature is currently available in: *Biography In Context*, *Canada In Context*, *Opposing Viewpoints In Context*, *Science In Context*, *Student Resources In Context*, *U.S. History In Context*, *World History In Context*. For the purposes of this document, we're using *Science In Context*.

### Follow these simple steps:

#### STEP ONE

Sign into your **Google Classroom account** from the banner of the database.



#### STEP TWO

**Find content that's useful to you.** In this example, we've found a document but you can also use the Share to Classroom tool for search results, topic pages, and more.



#### STEP FOUR

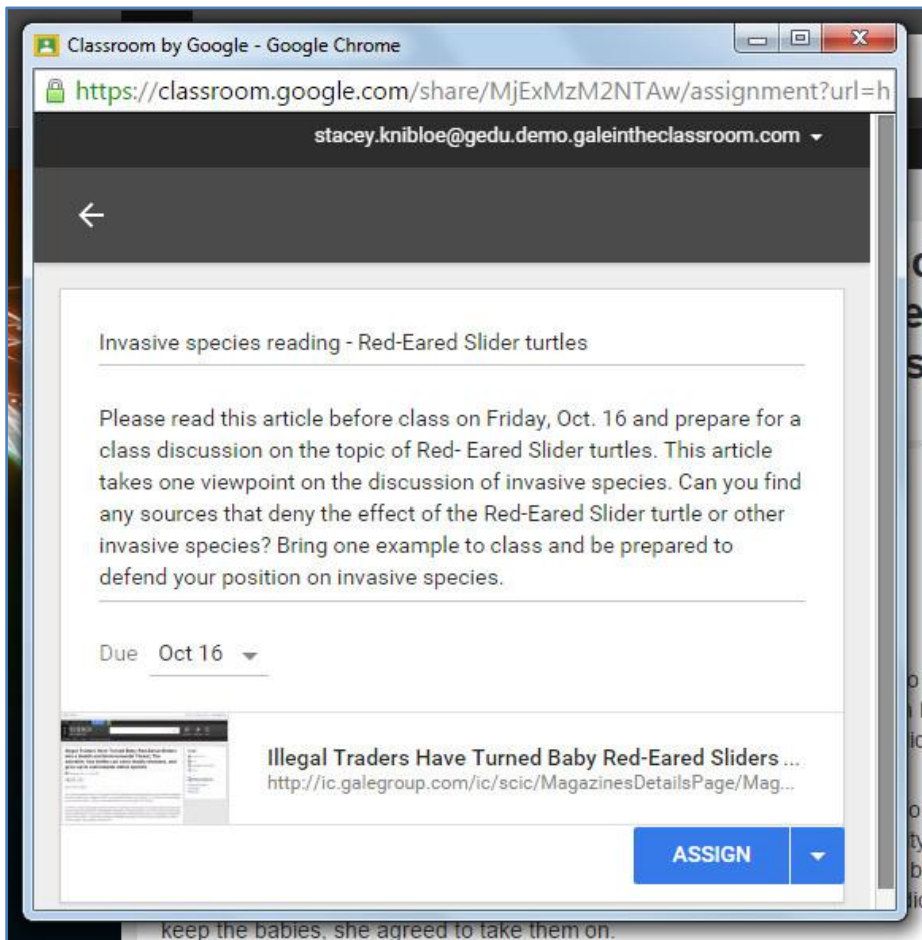
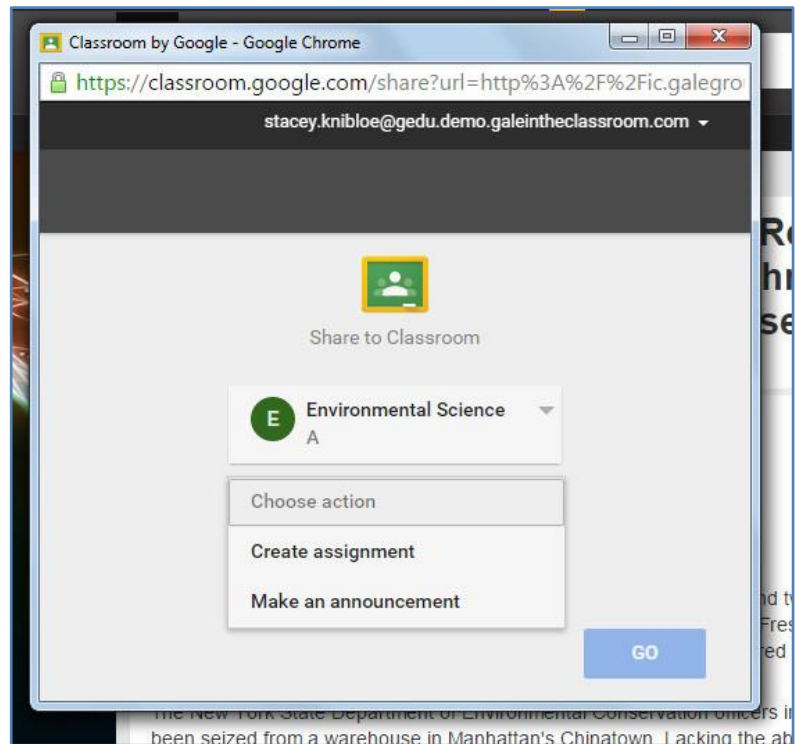
Click the **Share to Classroom** icon from the top banner.

*Note: If you haven't already logged into your Google account, you'll be prompted to do so at this step.*

**STEP FIVE**

You'll be asked to choose a class and then to choose an action:

- **Create Assignment** – Creates an assignment for all students in your class.
- **Make an Announcement** – Shares a link to the content on your Classroom Stream viewable by all registered for your class.



**STEP SIX**

We've chosen to create an assignment. This requires a title for the assignment, a description of the assignment, and a due date. Fill in these fields and click **Assign**.

**GOOGLE DRIVE INTEGRATION**

Gale resources also offer integration with Google Drive. Use the **Download** tool for individual documents and multiple documents in My Folder to share with students as well. (Note: Simply click the Save link for each article that interests you and it will automatically save to My Folder. When you're ready to download to Google Drive, you'll find My Folder in the More button.)

Another advantage of using Google Drive is any **Highlights and Notes** you add to a document will be available in the downloaded version of the document in Google Drive. You can Highlight important parts of a document and share your thoughts with students in Notes.

The item(s) will save to your Google Drive in a folder named for the database you're using. Then you can move them into your Classroom folder for use with students.
