Board Members

Dr. Callahan (Xenia) – Warner Middle School construction is currently underway; The football team is currently undefeated and will be attending playoffs; Currently working to update the lights and the stairs at the football stadium; There are two renewal levies on the ballot.

Mr. Uecker (Fairborn) – There was a ribbon cutting at the new intermediate school; Construction continues at the high school; Reduced participation fees by half for sports and other activities.

Mrs. Reagan (Greeneview) – Fall break is this week; Active threat training as part of professional development for staff took place this week; Allen Rowland, a teacher, was diagnosed with brain cancer, and students are fundraising for the family; A confidential tipline was established for students and parents to use if they have any concerns about safety; A new website will be online next week.

Adam Remaly (Bellbrook) – A 50-year bus driver and a 1969 graduate Belynda “Bo” Frieden and long-time soccer coach Charlie Luse were inducted into the BSS Hall of Fame in September; Scored well on the ODE Report Card.

Mr. Sheridan (Cedar Cliff) – The district is happy with their score on the ODE Report Card; There is a PI renewal levy on the ballot; On the special education rating all needs were met, but are continuously looking for staff for special education positions; The football team will have a winning season if they win the next two games; The high school volleyball team will be league champions if they win their next game.

Mr. McQueen (Yellow Springs) – During the Ohio School Safety Month different safety drills were performed at the schools; A Walk and Roll to School Day was held to encourage students to walk/roll or ride their bike to school; Homecoming was held during a recent soccer game where Eli Irich scored his 100th goal; Senior Service Day, a mandatory community service project, was held recently; The school play of *Peter Pan* will be held the weekend before Thanksgiving Break, and auditions for *Mama Mia* will be held soon after.

Mr. Taylor (Beavercreek) – In the midst of researching and sending out surveys to the public about building a new high school; Fall sports are finishing up, and the football team has a couple of wins this season.

Administrators

Eva Anderson (Treasurer) – The busyness of the start of school is starting to wind down, and things are going well: Life Insurance rate increase effective January 1.

Adult Education Updates – Basic Peace Officer Academy started on September 19, 2022. We currently have 18 cadets. Lebanon PD and Beavercreek PD are each sponsoring one cadet. Fairborn PD is sponsoring two cadets. Fairborn was here to recruit in September. They want to hire two more cadets to pay a salary while they are here. These cadets will have a job with Fairborn upon completion of the academy and passing the state test. We are hosting the Greene County Law Enforcement meeting on October 20th. Corrections Academy starts October 11th. We currently have 28 officers enrolled. We have multiple training dates scheduled for probation in October. The December Academy starts December 5th. We currently have 12 students enrolled.

Dave Deskins (Superintendent) – There is a new CTSO handbook currently being developed; A new guidebook has been created to showcase our programs; The Superintendent’s Business Advisory meeting was held this week; Governor DeWine, his wife, Fran DeWine, and grandson, Parker, all visited the Career Center this week; Looking into safety options for the school.
