19-9/23 Reports

Board Members

Mr. Steining (Fairborn) – Friday night is the last football game at the current facility. The new stadium is underway. The football team is doing well having recently beating Xenia. Built a new training facility and were quoted \$3.5 million for the project but the final total came in at \$3 million.

Mr. Sheridan (Cedar Cliff) – Superintendent search is going well; The preschool lease is being terminated in July 2024 since more space is needed for resource rooms; With the new home values being released, many of the homes in the district are still undervalued; Fall sports are doing really well with the varsity football team 12th in the state, volleyball is 17-4, middle school volleyball were OHC champions, girls tennis are OHC champions, and cross country finished 10th; School report cards were released and the district is currently ranked 2nd in the county.

Dr. Callahan (Xenia) – Campaigning for open board positions is underway; Trunk or Treat will be hosted at the high school October 24th; The Warned project is taking shape; The cellphone bags are going well in the district.

Mr. Taylor (Beavercreek) – The football team is in a rebuilding season; The marching band performances are going very well; The first quarter is wrapping up for the district; Presented to the League of Women Voters of Beavercreek this past week; 1,450 Beavercreek students attended Homecoming this year; Attended an emotional intelligence presentation for parents of students; The first community forum is being hosted October 12 in coordination with Beavercreek Township.

Mr. Remaly (Bellbrook) – Tom Bean, Carrie Gainey Dunham, and Gregg Sparks were inducted into the Bellbrook-Sugarcreek School District Hall of Fame on October 6; Dr. Ceccarelli is scheduled to speak about mental health to parents on October 16 and to middle school students October 19; The district is one of eight in the state to earn six 5-star grades on their district report card.

Mr. McQueen (Yellow Springs) – September 12 was Grandfriends Day at the elementary; Walk and Roll to School Day was held on October 4; The Halloween Parade will take place downtown on October 31; The Haunted Homecoming was well attended this year with 200 students participating; The district is currently looking in Yonder bags for cellphones; There is a levy on the ballot for a new building.

Administrators

Eva Anderson (Treasurer) – It is currently audit season in the office. Currently a food service audit and annual fiscal audit are underway.

Adult Education Updates –The September Basic Police Academy started September 11th. We currently have 20 students enrolled and 2 prior-equivalent enrollments (individuals who were police officers in other states) for a total of 22 cadets. Nine of our cadets are sponsored by either Centerville PD, Warren County SO, Miamisburg PD, University of Dayton PD, Xenia PD, or Greene County SO. The first Advisory meeting took place September 21, 2023. Field Training Course starts October 2nd and ends on the 5th. The Corrections Academy will begin on October 10th, currently 20 have enrolled. Our First Line Supervision Class is November 27- 30.

Dave Deskins (Superintendent) – Applied for the SUPER Rapids grant to help fund the HVAC lab that is scheduled to be ready by next school year; On Monday an OFCC meeting took place and the design manual was discussed and will hopefully be updated; An adult education grant has also been applied to help with the cost of virtual reality training equipment; A drivers education grant is also in the works, but there are many questions about the lack of funding for it.
