The Superintendent recommends Community Civil Engineers, LLC (the "Design Professional") as the most qualified firm to provide design and construction administration services for the New Parking Lot Project (the "Project") and the Superintendent requests authorization to negotiate an agreement with the Design Professional for these services.

Rationale:

- 1. The Board requires the services of a design professional to provide design and construction administration services for the Project.
- 2. Section 153.71 of the Ohio Revised Code prescribes a truncated qualifications-based selection process for projects with an estimated design professional fee of less than \$50,000, wherein the District may

- select a single design professional from among those that have submitted a current statement of qualifications within the immediately preceding year, based on the District's determination that the selected design professional is the most qualified to provide the required professional design services.
- 3. The Design Professional's fee for the design and construction administration services was estimated to be less than \$15,000; the Design Professional's statement of qualifications was submitted to the District within the immediately preceding year; and the District determined the Design Professional to be the most qualified to provide the design and construction administration services.
- 4. Upon selection, the Design Professional will provide a proposal to perform the design and construction administration services and the District, working with legal counsel, will negotiate and enter into a contract with the Design Professional in an amount not to exceed \$15,000.

The Board of Education resolves as follows:

- 1. Pursuant to its authority under R.C. 153.71, the Board selects the Design Professional as the firm determined best qualified to perform the design and construction administration services for the Project.
- 2. The Board authorizes the Superintendent to work with legal counsel to negotiate a contract with the Design Professional in an amount not to exceed \$15,000 and authorizes the Superintendent and Treasurer to execute such contract on the Board's behalf as well as any other related documentation necessary to give effect to this resolution.
