Marion City Schools Pass Renewal Levy

(Marion, OH) Voters turned out to support the Marion City Schools five-year renewal levy that was on the Nov. 2 ballot.

"We are incredibly grateful that our community voted to support this renewal levy, especially to those who volunteered countless hours to campaign on behalf of the school district," said Superintendent Ron Iarussi. "The continued support by Marion families of this levy that has been in effect since 1989 is incredible."

Voters supported the renewal levy with over 58% of the vote, based upon final, unofficial results from the Marion County Board of Elections.

"The passage of this renewal levy will generate \$2 million per year to maintain our operating costs, including teachers and staff, technology, supplies, maintenance and utilities," said Treasurer Veronica Reinhart. "Marion City Schools remains committed to offering a great educational experience for students at a good value to residents."
