COUNSELOR'S CORNER



Monclova Primary has been a very busy place these past few weeks!

Kindergarten

I am in the process of visiting each of the Kindergarten classrooms to present a drug awareness lesson. The lesson focuses on over-the-counter and prescription drugs, as it discusses making

"Safe & Healthy Choices." The students learn that trusted adults can help them to make safe and healthy choices because they help us to feel safe, listen to us, and answer our questions. We also discuss the rules of medicine and how we should only take medicine with the help of a trusted adult – like a parent or a medical professional. We determine that if we are uncertain about the contents of any food, drink, or substance, we "Don't Touch! Don't Taste! Don't Take! – Tell a Trusted Adult!" We also learn about the differences between Safe & Healthy and Unsafe & Unhealthy Choices.

Second Grade

This week, I visited each of the second grade classrooms and presented a drug awareness lesson. The lesson focused on over-the-counter and prescription drugs, as we discussed making "Safe & Healthy Choices." The students learned that trusted adults can help them to make safe and healthy choices because they help us to feel safe, listen to us, and answer our questions. We also discussed the rules of medicine and how we should only take medicine with the help of a trusted adult - like a parent or a medical professional. We determined that if we are uncertain about the contents of any food, drink, or substance, we "Don't Touch! Don't Taste! Don't Take! - Tell a Trusted Adult!" The students learned that safe and healthy choices protect their brain and that it is very important to use medicines correctly, in order to keep their brain and body functioning properly. We also determined the differences between Safe & Healthy and Unsafe & Unhealthy Choices. The students learned and practiced the "Stop, Think, Choose" decisionmaking model, a strategy that they can use to help them make safe and healthy decisions. Finally, we practiced the best way to say "NO" to peers when presented with an unsafe and unhealthy choice, a skill that is helpful not only when medicine is involved - but also in many other situations.

Third Grade

Last week, I visited each of the third grade classrooms and presented a drug awareness lesson. The lesson focused on

over-the-counter and prescription drugs, as we discussed making "Safe & Healthy Choices." The students learned about making choices that are right for them, as well as the positive and negative consequences that are associated with our decisions. We reviewed the rules for medication safety, and the students learned how thinking ahead in certain situations can help us to avoid making unsafe and unhealthy decisions. The students also reviewed the "Stop, Think, Choose" model to make safe and healthy choices. They learned how standing up for yourself can be an effective and important strategy to let others know what you want in a manner that they want to listen to you; however, doing so is not always an easy task. The students learned that standing up for yourself involves using good eye contact, while firmly and politely telling others your needs and ideas in a clear and direct manner, without arguing or acting in an aggressive manner. Finally, the students practiced using the skill of Standing Up for Yourself, a skill that is helpful not only when medicine is involved – but also in many other situations.

Physical Activity / Fitness Our classes have focused on the trending sport of


