COUNSELOR'S CORNER



First Grade

Recently, I visited each of the first grade classrooms to present the third <u>Sources of Strength</u> lesson. This lesson was entitled "We Can Make a Difference," and it focused on the concept of how we can help others in times of need. We

they are in need of help, and there also may be times when what we do to help others doesn't work or is not enough and we need to connect our friends and classmates to a trusted adult for assistance. The students learned that connecting with a trusted adult should only be used for the purpose of getting help for someone else, as opposed to an attempt to get someone else in trouble. We distinguished between the concepts of "tattling" and "telling" and the motives behind both of these concepts, in order to help the students better understand when it is appropriate to enlist the assistance of a trusted adult. We discussed how a Positive Friend helps to connect someone to the assistance that they need, in times of concern. The students learned about the concept of Empathy, which is the ability to understand what someone else might be thinking or feeling. We also learned about "I statements," a strategy for respectfully telling others how we feel. We discussed how "I statements" can be used to help us understand who was impacted and how, and they can

discussed how sometimes we can assist others when

help us to share what we feel and experienced in the situation without blaming others. We reviewed the eight "Strengths" from the Sources of Strength Wheel, which include: Family Support, Positive Friends, Mentors, Healthy Activities, Generosity, Spirituality, Physical Health, and Mental Health. These "Strengths" help the students to identify the many positive people, places, and things in their lives that make them to feel happy, connected, and help during difficult times. I hope that these lessons have challenged the students to think about the "Strengths" in their lives and how they can use these to regulate their brains and bodies during times of need. As parents, I encourage you to extend our learning to home by identifying the "Strengths" in your lives with your son/ daughter and discussing how we all can use our own personal strengths during challenging times and to help us become the best versions of ourselves.

Kindergarten

This week, I visited each of the kindergarten classrooms to present the third Sources of Strength lesson. This lesson was entitled "We Can Make a Difference," and it focused on the concept of how we can help others in times of need. We discussed how sometimes we can use our strengths to assist others when they are in need of help. The students learned about the concept of Empathy, which is the ability to understand what someone else might be thinking or feeling. We discussed that during a conflict, our emotions can get big and people's feelings can be hurt. The students learned that listening to others can improve a conflict and help us understand what others are thinking or feeling. We reviewed the parts of a Helpful Apology – See the Hurt and Help the Hurt. The students learned that listening is an important part of helping the hurt. We also reviewed the eight "Strengths" from the Sources of Strength Wheel, which include: Family Support, Positive Friends, Mentors, Healthy Activities, Generosity, Spirituality, Physical Health, and Mental Health. These "Strengths" help the students to identify the many positive people, places, and things in their lives that make them to feel happy, connected, and help during difficult times. I hope that these lessons have challenged the students to think about the "Strengths" in their lives and how they can use these to regulate their brains and bodies during times of need and big emotions. As parents, I encourage you to extend our learning to home by identifying the "Strengths" in your lives with your son/daughter and discussing how we all can use our own personal strengths during challenging times and to help us become the best versions of ourselves.

additional opportunity to earn "Lunch with the Principal" this spring, so it is very important to keep working hard and exhibiting the "General" Expectations of Respect, Responsibility, and Safety throughout the remainder of the school year. It is always important to remind your child about the significance of continuing to follow the "General" Expectations, as the end of the year brings much excitement with the onset of warmer weather and end of the year activities. We want the students to end the year strong and on a positive note, in all aspects of school. Having a reminder discussion with your child is always a good idea!

Monclova Primary has been a very busy place lately! The third and fourth graders have been working hard on the ELA Ohio State Test (OST). We will conclude testing next week with the Math OST for third and fourth grade students.
