COMMUNITY

Washington Local Schools are located in the northwest section of the city of Toledo, Ohio. Washington Local Schools is a public school district serving students from kindergarten through 12th grade. At Washington Local Schools, we strive to provide an excellent education and individual attention. The school system is composed of eight elementary schools, two junior high schools and one high school.

SCHOOL

Whitmer High School is a four-year public comprehensive high school that offers a challenging college preparatory program with an enrollment of 2,233 students in grades 9 through 12 with approximately 500 juniors and seniors enrolled in our Career Technical Center. Whitmer also offers a virtual learning opportunity through the APEX platform in our Panther Virtual Academy (PVA) that students complete coursework independently. Developed during the 19/20 school year, The Portrait of a Panther identifies empathy, communication, adaptability, integrity, critical thinking, and a learner's mindset as the important 21st century skills that the graduates of Washington Local Schools should embody and exemplify by the time of graduation. These competencies will empower our students to be college, career, and life ready.

CURRICULUM

Whitmer High School operates on a seven period day. There are two semesters, each with two terms, the first from August to January, and the second from January to June. Credit is granted each semester.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND HONORS PROGRAM

Selected 11th and 12th grade students engage in college-level coursework through Advanced Placement (AP). Whitmer offers the following AP courses: Calculus AB, German Language & Culture, English Literature and Composition, English Language and Composition, Spanish Language & Culture, and U.S. Government and Politics.

Whitmer offers the following Honors level courses: English 9, English 10, Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, Physical Science, Biology, Chemistry, Anatomy Physiology, Physics, World History, American History, Sociology, Psychology, and Music. Many of the programs at Whitmer's Career Technology Center offer honors credit as well.

COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS

Students may take classes at local universities or colleges through the College Credit Plus Program. Whitmer partners with the University of Toledo, Lourdes University, and Owens Community College. Many of the Career Technology Center's programs also offer dual enrollment courses where students earn both high school and college credit.

GRADING SYSTEM

Whitmer does not identify a valedictorian or a salutatorian. GPA is calculated on a weighted 4.0 scale and includes all high school courses taken at Whitmer.
