Dear BOCES Community,

On January 6th, we confirmed that a student tested positive for COVID-19. The student attends the afternoon welding program at OAOC and was in attendance on January 4th and 5th.

After review of the classroom and lab practices by the Department of Health, it has been determined that one student had direct exposure and requires quarantine. No other staff or students had direct exposure to the positive case while in the program. Therefore, BOCES has **not** been advised to move the class to remote learning at this time.

The Otsego Department of Health will be working with the home school to determine any close contacts on the bus.

Staff and students in the welding program should self-monitor for any symptoms that arise within the next 10 days and consult with the school nurse or your health care provider if there are any concerns.

News like this positive case can be received with mixed emotions. As always, the safety and health of our students and staff are our top priority. We continue to work to support our students, families, and employees during this difficult time and appreciate your cooperation.
