

Dear BOCES Community,

We were informed today that a student who attends Oneonta and was visiting our OAOC campus on Tuesday tested positive for COVID. In consultation with the Otsego County Department of Health, we need to quarantine some students and staff in our Culinary Arts and Visual Communications programs (AM) at OAOC. Impacted students and staff as well as our component school districts have been notified. Students and staff impacted by this exposure will return to their programs on Monday, March 29th. We have been advised by the Otsego County Department of Health that only those students and staff who have already been notified need to be quarantined and shift to remote learning at this point. **Only our AM Visual Communications program at OAOC will be remote through Friday, March 26th.**

As always, the safety and health of our students and staff are the top priority. We continue to work to support our students, families, and employees during this difficult time and appreciate your cooperation. What we are learning through these experiences with positive cases and potential positive cases is the importance of our health protocols such as wearing masks and maintaining social distance. These protocols are making a difference and limiting exposure. Good hygiene practices such as frequent hand washing remain important steps we all can take to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.
