Dear BOCES Community,

Over the weekend, we were notified that one of our BOCES employees and one of our BOCES students at the OAOC campus tested positive for the COVID-19 virus. The two cases are unrelated.

New York State Department of Health guidance advises that the local health department investigates and contacts anyone who may have been exposed. We are currently working with the Otsego County Department of Health staff to trace any close contacts to the employee or student.

On Monday, November 2nd, we will move to remote learning for all students and staff at our OAOC campus. This shift to remote learning allows time for contact tracing and additional cleaning. If you are a staff member that needs access to the building for any reason, please contact your immediate supervisor.

News like this can be received with mixed emotions. As always, the safety and health of our students and staff are our top priority. We continue to work to support our students, families, and employees during this difficult time and appreciate your cooperation.
