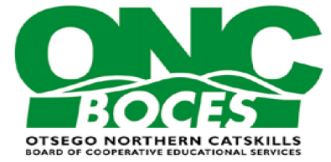

Dear BOCES Community,

We were informed today that a student at OAOC has tested positive for COVID. In consultation with the Otsego County Department of Health, we have decided to shift our morning session Automotive Services Technician program to remote instruction through February 1st. Students and staff will return to that program on February 2nd. **This shift to remote affects ONLY the morning Automotive Services Technician program at OAOC.** We have notified impacted students and staff as well as our component school districts. We have been advised by the Otsego County Department of Health that only our morning session Automotive Services Technician program needs to shift to remote learning at this point.

As always, the safety and health of our students and staff are the top priority. We continue to work to support our students, families, and employees during this difficult time and appreciate your cooperation. What we are learning through these experiences with positive cases and potential positive cases is the importance of our health protocols such as wearing masks and maintaining social distance. These protocols are making a difference and limiting exposure. Good hygiene practices such as frequent hand washing remain important steps we all can take to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.
