WHAT TO EXPECT



HIGH SCHOOL

Health Check

- Prior to arriving to the school building, students are asked to perform a personal health check.
 - Take your temperature to verify you do not have a fever.
 - Ask yourself the following questions:
 - Do you have a new cough or sore throat?
 - Are you experiencing unexplained shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
 - Do you have unexplained joint/muscle soreness or headache?
 - Do you have unexplained tiredness or fatigue?
 - Are you experiencing new loss of taste or smell?
 - Are you experiencing gastrointestinal symptoms (i.e. diarrhea, vomiting, etc.)
 - Have you been in contact with anyone who has shown symptoms or been diagnosed with COVID-19?
- ✓ If you answer YES to any of these questions OR have a temperature of 100 or higher, DO NOT report to school and report your symptoms to district health staff.

If your child is tested for COVID-19, do not send them to school until you receive results back and they are negative.

Facial Coverings (=)

 Students are required to wear cloth facial coverings while inside school buildings/ facilities, outside when 6 feet of social distancing cannot be maintained and while on school buses.



- School buses will run routes daily. Route details are available on the school district's website.
- ✓ Students are required to wear cloth facial



 Students and staff will be required to wash or sanitize their hands upon arrival to school each morning, before lunch and after lunch. Hand sanitizer will be available in all classrooms and high traffic spaces in school buildings.



- ✓ The school day will begin at 8:30 a.m. Dismissal will begin at 3:30 p.m.
- ✓ Students will report to school on designated days and work remotely
 - the other days of the week following the "Blue-Gold" rotation below:

coverings while on the school bus and sanitize their hands upon entering the bus.

Entering the Building

- ✓ The school building will be open at 8:10 a.m. for entry.
- ✓ Parent drop offs, walkers and senior drivers (and students who ride with them) should enter the building at the front main entrance. Bus riders and junior/sophomore drivers (and students who ride with them) should enter at the secondary entrance at the art plaza.
- ✓ Junior/sophomore drivers (and students who ride with them) should enter the building at the side art plaza entrance.



District staff will check the temperature of students upon entry each morning. Students who have a temperature of 100 or higher will not be permitted to remain at school.

Weekly rotation will continue if the district remains in Tier 2

✓ On Remote learning days, students will ZOOM into the classroom at the start of each class period. Log in information will be provided by the classroom teacher.



- Students will eat lunch in a variety of spaces including the hub, media center and student patio to accommodate social distancing.
- Students in grades 11 & 12 are encouraged to go home for lunch. Other students are encouraged to pack their lunch; grab and go and hot lunch options are available for purchase.



✓ Only staff and students will be permitted in classrooms and the academic areas of school buildings. Visitors will be restricted to school offices only during the school day and are required to wear cloth facial coverings.
