MEETING RECAP

JUNE | 2024

CONSENT AGENDA

- The Board of Education approved the employment of Kelley Dunlap (MHS office aide), Christian Compton (MJHS intensive behavior support aide), Anna Goecke (TPE registered behavior tech), Autumn Richards (MHS Director of College and Career Counseling), Emily Jacobs (TPE reading specialist, 0.4 to 0.45), Pam Tackett (MHS counselor, 0.6 to 0.8), Julie Parker (TPE rehire for 2024-25 school year), Zachary Van Fossen (MHS math teacher) and Amanda Loy (TPE first grade teacher). It also approved the resignations of Zach Conkle (ME IS), and Sarah Conkle (TPE teacher), the retirement of Annette Engle (TPE teacher) and an hours/days adjustment for Rachel Bystry (after school enrichment).
- Pre-approval requests and reimbursements for college credits were approved for Jacqueline Treftz (TPE, 8 hours for approval and additional reimbursements).
- Additional items approved by the BOE include the hiring of sports camp coaches and summer workers, up to 15 extra days for Autumn Richards and limited contracts for the 2024-25 school year.

FINANCIAL REPORT

- Treasurer/CFO Tom Golinar reviewed the financial report and investments for the month of May and announced that all district finances are on track per the forecast and the district is 90% through the fiscal year. He also reported on some end of year transfers, including the track replacement funds, turf replacement funds and lunch money funds.
- A renewal of the district's contract with Aramark food services for FY25 was approved by the Board, as well as the temporary appropriations for FY25, the supplemental appropriations for FY24 and an amendment to the superintendent and treasurer contracts.
- A Resolution to Proceed with a November 2024 Operating Levy was approved by the Board of Education.

REPORTS/INFORMATION/COMMUNICATION/DISCUSSION

- Director of Human Resources and District Operations Lance Hollander presented the Board with a list of 18 district policies, as well as the athletic handbook, for a first read. No action was taken and the Board will vote to approve at the July Board of Education meeting.

- The Board recognized six Mariemont Junior High School students who recently competed at the state Power of the Pen competition.
- Additionally, Mariemont Police Chief Richard Hines was awarded the 2024 Marie Huenefeld Friend of the School Award. Superintendent Estep was joined by the award's namesake, longtime Board of Education member Marie Huenefeld, to present Chief Hines with the award.
