ACTION AGENDA

- The Board passed a resolution dispensing with statutory bidding procedures due to conditions of urgent necessity related to the placement of the chiller at Mariemont Elementary School. The power failure on May 11 resulted in the failure of both compressors at the school which need to be replaced.
- The BOE approved a replacement of the Mariemont High School track during the summer of 2023.
 Director of Human Resources and District Operations Lance Hollander reported that the new track will
 be a "sandwich track," meaning the district will save around \$300,000 over the lifetime of the travk with
 less maintenance needs. He also reported that Athletic Director Tom Nerl raised \$176,000 in private
 donations for the project.
- Contracts for the superintendent and treasurer were both approved, effective August 1, 2023.
- The BOE approved a resolution and contract to replace the public address systems at Mariemont Elementary School, Terrace Park Elementary School and Mariemont Junior High School. Mr. Hollander reported that the PA systems were in need of replacement and considered safety concerns. The cost of all three is \$346,000, however, the district was awarded a pair of safety grants worth \$300,000 that will be used to offset much of the cost of the PA systems.
