## WHAT TO EXPECT

ELEMENTARY

## Facial Coverings (=)

 Students are required to wear cloth facial coverings while inside school buildings/facilities, outside when 6 feet of social distancing cannot be maintained and while on school buses.

# Health Check

- Prior to arriving to the school building, students are asked to perform a personal health check.
- Take your temperature to verify you do not have a fever.
- Ask yourself the following questions:
  - Do you have a new cough or sore throat?
- Are you experiencing unexplained shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
- Do you have unexplained joint/muscle soreness or headache?
- Do you have unexplained tiredness or fatigue?
- Are you experiencing new loss of taste or smell?
- Are you experiencing gastrointestinal symptoms (i.e. diarrhea, vomiting, etc.)
- Have you been in contact with anyone who has shown symptoms or been diagnosed with COVID-19?
- ✓ If you answer YES to any of these questions OR have a temperature of 100 or higher, DO NOT report to school and report your symptoms to district health staff.

If your child is tested for COVID-19, do not send them to school until you receive results back and they are negative.



 District staff will check the temperature of students upon entry each morning. Students who have a temperature of 100 or higher will not be permitted to remain at school.



- ✓ School buses will run routes daily. Route details are available on the school district's website.
- Students are required to wear cloth facial coverings while on the school bus and sanitize their hands upon entering the bus.



Hand washing/sanitizing

 Students and staff will be required to wash or sanitize their hands upon arrival to school each morning, before lunch and after lunch. Hand sanitizer will be available in all classrooms and high traffic spaces in school buildings.



## Building

 $\checkmark\,$  The school building will be open at 8:10 a.m. for entry.

### Mariemont Elementary

- Students with last names A-M and ALL bus riders should enter the school building at the main entrance (off of West Street).
- Students with last names N-Z should enter the building at the dining hall doors (off of Plainville Road).

### ✓ Terrace Park Elementary

- Bus riders, walkers and bike riders should enter the school building at the dining hall entrance (off the playground).
- Car riders should enter the building at the main entrance (off the circle drop off).



✓ Only staff and students will be permitted in classrooms and the academic areas of school buildings. Visitors will be restricted to school offices only during the school day and are required to wear cloth facial coverings.



Students will be assigned "recess zones" by homeroom with a variety of activities. Cloth facial coverings will be required when 6 feet of social distancing cannot be maintained.

- ✓ The school day will begin at 8:30 a.m. Dismissal will begin at 2:30 p.m.
- ✓ Students in grades K-2 will report to school daily. Instruction will take place in classrooms and other designated areas throughout the building to accommodate smaller groups of students.
- Students in kindergarten through second grade will continue to attend school every day. Their daily schedule has been adjusted to allow changes between homeroom and specials classrooms on a more frequent basis. Students will still spend an equal amount of time in each setting, but changes will occur more often instead of changing every two to three days. Homeroom teachers will communicate the schedule in their weekly newsletter.
- Students in grades 3-6 will report to school on designated days and work remotely the other days of the week following the "Blue-Gold" rotation below:

#### Weekly rotation will continue if the district remains in Tier 2

✓ On Remote learning days, students will ZOOM into the classroom at the start of each class period. Log in information will be provided by the classroom teacher.



- Students will eat lunch with their homeroom in the classroom, dining hall and/or gymnasium to accommodate social distancing.
- ✓ Students are encouraged to go home for lunch when possible. If staying at school, students are encouraged to pack their lunch; grab and go options will be available for purchase.
