

WHAT TO EXPECT

Tier 1

ELEMENTARY

Facial Coverings

- ✓ Students are required to wear cloth facial coverings while inside school buildings/facilities, outside when 6 feet of social distancing cannot be maintained and while on school buses.
- ✓ Students will be given two cloth facial coverings at their phase-in day. Students can also choose to wear their own facial covering as long as it fully covers the mouth, nose, and chin and fits snugly against the side of the nose, side of the face and covers the chin so there are no gaps.

School Transportation

- ✓ School buses will run routes daily. Route details are available on the school district's website.
- ✓ Students are required to wear cloth facial coverings while on the school bus and sanitize their hands upon entering the bus.

Entering the Building

- ✓ The school building will be open at 8:10 a.m. for entry.
- ✓ **Mariemont Elementary**
 - Students with last names A-M and ALL bus riders should enter the school building at the main entrance (off of West Street).
 - Students with last names N-Z should enter the building at the dining hall doors (off of Plainville Road).
- ✓ **Terrace Park Elementary**
 - Bus riders, walkers and bike riders should enter the school building at the dining hall entrance (off the playground).
 - Car riders should enter the building at the main entrance (off the circle drop off).

Visitors

- ✓ Only staff and students will be permitted in classrooms and the academic areas of school buildings. Visitors will be restricted to school offices only during the school day and are required to wear cloth facial coverings.

Health Check

- ✓ Prior to arriving to the school building, students are asked to perform a personal health check.
 - Take your temperature to verify you do not have a fever.
 - Ask yourself the following questions:
 - Do you have a new cough or sore throat?
 - Are you experiencing unexplained shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
 - Do you have unexplained joint/muscle soreness or headache?
 - Do you have unexplained tiredness or fatigue?
 - Are you experiencing new loss of taste or smell?
 - Are you experiencing gastrointestinal symptoms (i.e. diarrhea, vomiting, etc.)
 - Have you been in contact with anyone who has shown symptoms or been diagnosed with COVID-19?
- ✓ If you answer YES to any of these questions OR have a temperature of 100 or higher, DO NOT report to school and report your symptoms to district health staff.

If your child is tested for COVID-19, do not send them to school until you receive results back and they are negative.

Temperature Assessment

- ✓ District staff will check the temperature of students upon entry each morning. Students who have a temperature of 100 or higher will not be permitted to remain at school.

Hand washing/sanitizing

- ✓ Students and staff will be required to wash or sanitize their hands upon arrival to school each morning, before lunch and after lunch. Hand sanitizer will be available in all classrooms and high traffic spaces in school buildings.

Instructional Schedule

- ✓ The school day will begin at 8:30 a.m. Dismissal will begin at 3:20 p.m.
- ✓ All students will report to school daily.

Lunch

- ✓ Students will eat lunch with their homeroom in the classroom, dining hall and/or gymnasium to accommodate social distancing.
- ✓ Students are encouraged to go home for lunch when possible. If staying at school, students are encouraged to pack their lunch; grab and go options will be available for purchase.

Recess

- ✓ Students will be assigned "recess zones" by homeroom with a variety of activities. Cloth facial coverings will be required when 6 feet of social distancing cannot be maintained.
