FINANCIAL REPORT

 Treasurer/CFO Tom Golinar reviewed the financial report and announced that all district finances are on track.

REPORTS/INFORMATION/COMMUNICATIONS/DISCUSSION

- At the request of the Board of Education, Assistant Superintendent Wise gave a report on his findings
 of meeting recording options. He met with ICRC to review possibilities of recording meetings in the ME
 cafeteria and where cameras would be stationed.
 - If the Board chose to use ICRC for Board meetings, the ME cafeteria would have to be the permanent location of future Board meetings because of the tremendous work and cost associated with removing wiring and re-installing it in a different location.
 - The Board requested Mr. Wise to put together an in-depth plan on audio-only recording options and he will present his findings soon.
- Superintendent Estepp and Assistant Superintendent Wise presented the Board of Education with the latest COVID-19 update for the district.
 - The Board of Education had a lengthy discussion on options for re-implementing masks back into our school buildings. After careful consideration, the Board voted 4-1 to implement a temporary masking requirement for all students, staff and visitors during the school day. The requirement went into effect on January 12 and will remain through January 28.
