## CONSENT AGENDA

- The Board of Education approved the retirement of TPE health aide Holly McCormack and ME library aide Sue Hendricks, as well as TPE fourth grade teacher Karrie Coates who will be re-hired at the end of the 2025-26 school year. It also approved the employment of Julie Bell (MHS, special education aide), resignations of Lindsay Oberschlake (MTSS Coordinator) and Stephanie Shank (ME, intervention specialist) and hours/days adjustments for Tessa Mullen (15 additional hours per week) and Kelley Dunlap (MHS, office aide, 5 additional hours per week).
- Payments were approved for MHS musical pit musicians and college credit pre-approval requests and reimbursements were approved for Aaron Pfeffenberger (MJHS, 2 credits) and Ashley Toon (TPE).

## ACTION AGENDA

- The Board of Education approved a resolution for special education model policies and procedures, as well as a girls lacrosse trip to Columbus, Ohio, on April 17-18, 2026.
- The Board approved two policies after a first reading during the February meeting. The only changes were regarding kindergarten enrollment for next school year and beyond.

## FINANCIAL REPORT

- Treasurer/CFO Tom Golinar reviewed the financial report and investments for the months of February and March. He shared that the reports are on track per the forecast.
- He also announced the retire/rehire of Karrie Coates and Amy Uhl with a hearing at the June 8 Board of Education meeting.
