# MEETING RECAP

September | 2022

## CONSENT AGENDA

- Payment was approved for staff members who worked this summer's Camp BEyond for elementary students as well as summer reading programs and summer professional development stipends.
- The employment of six special education and instructional aides was approved as well as the district's Administrative Services Coordinator. Superintendent Estapp reported that the district has filled all but one aide position for the school year to date.
- The Board of Education accepted the resignation of MJHS special education aide Philip Helbig.
- The Board also approved the hours/days adjustments for Maura Hayscar who will serve as a special education bus aide and for Sue Hendricks, the ME library aide.
- College credit pre-approvals and reimbursements were approved for nine staff members.

## FINANCIAL REPORT

- Treasurer/CFO Tom Golinar reviewed the financial report and announced that all district finances are on track per the forecast.
- Mr. Golinar reported on the appropriations for fiscal year 2023 which includes about \$1 million in ESSER Covid-19 relief dollars that is still available to be spent over the next two school years. Almost all of the remaining ESSER dollars are budgeted to protect the district's general fund.
- The Board approved the School Resource Officer (SRO) agreement. The district shares this cost with the village of Mariemont.
- The Board also approved a location switch for two upcoming regular Board of Education meetings. The meetings scheduled for November 7 and December 12 will now be held at Mariemont High School.
