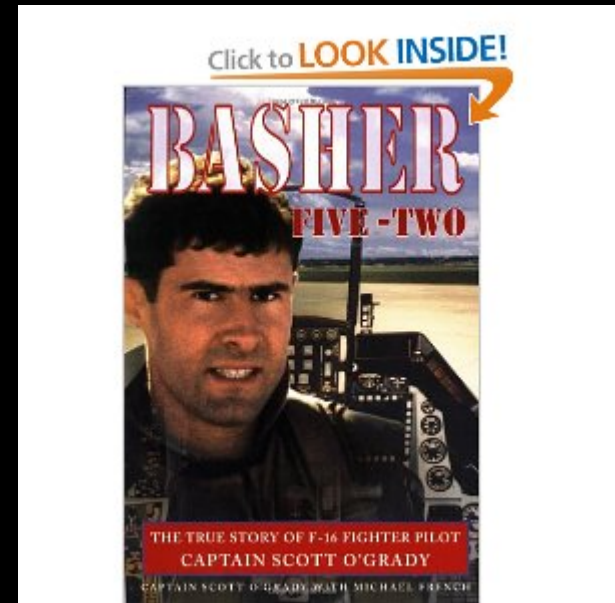
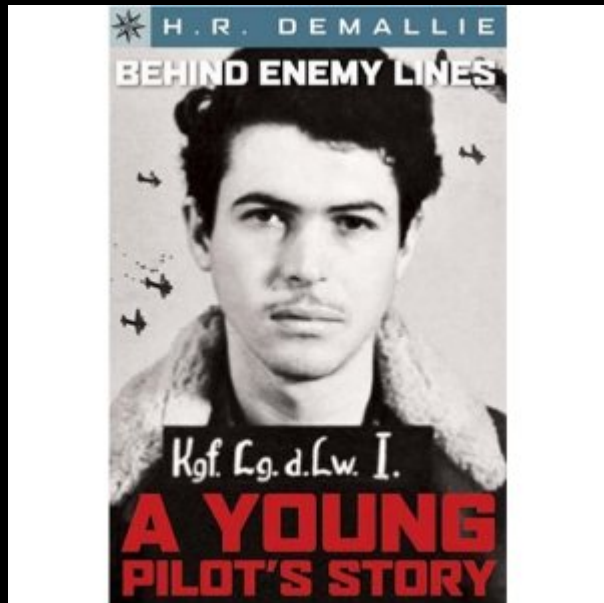


# BASHER FIVE-TWO

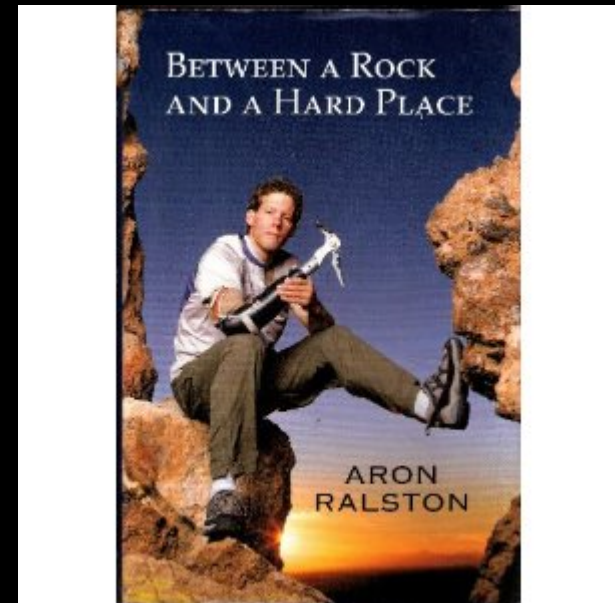
# BEHIND ENEMY LINES



- This book is an unforgettable autobiographical tale of survival during World War II.

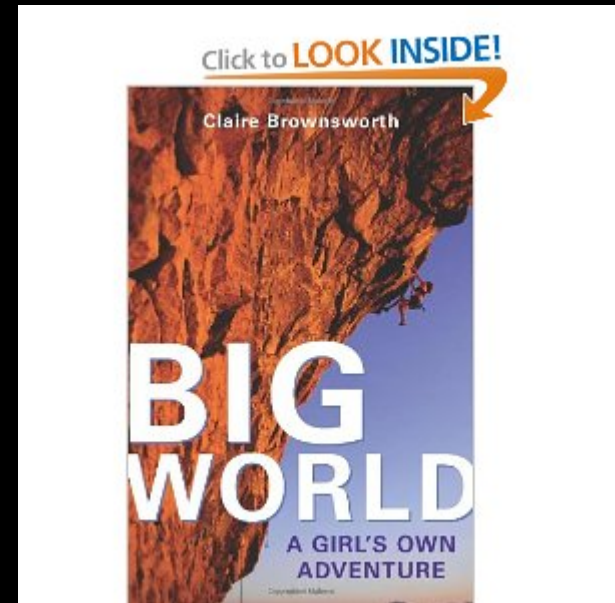
# BETWEEN A ROCK AND A HARD PLACE

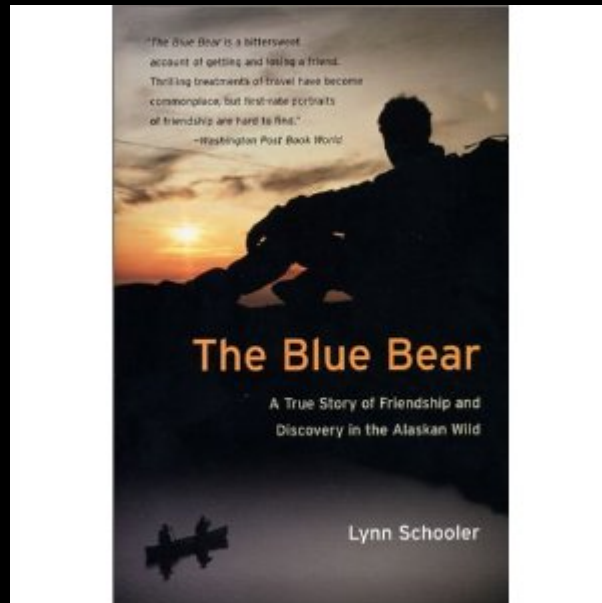


# THE BLACK DEATH

- This book discusses the pivotal moment in history when one out of three people died and changed the course of world history, the Black Death.

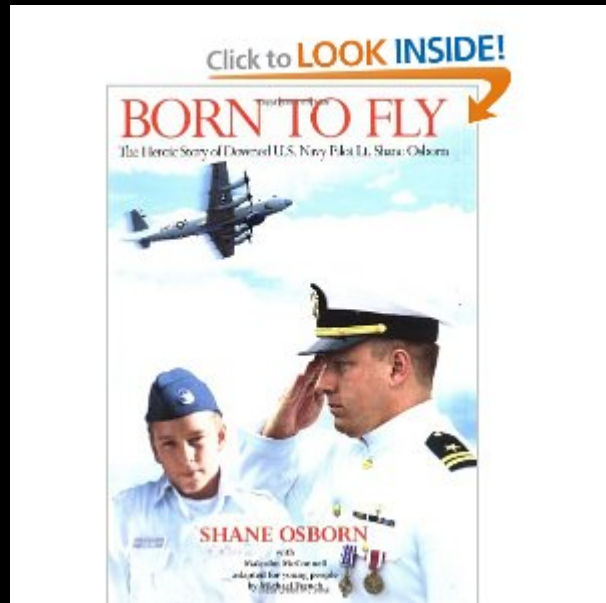


# THE BLUE BEAR

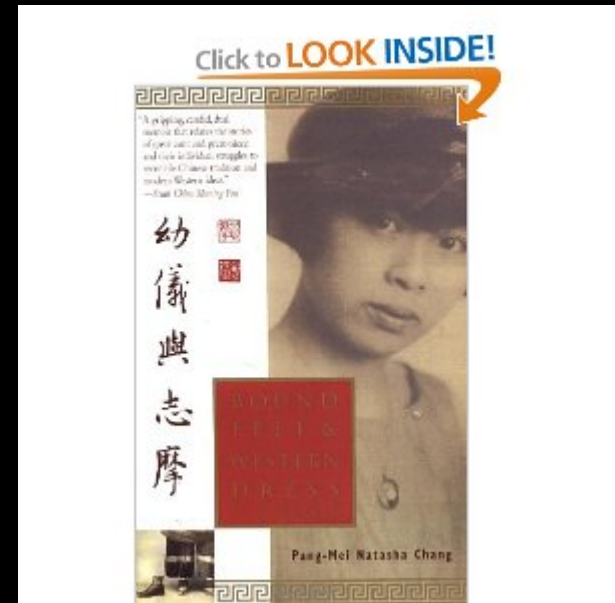
# BORN TO FLY

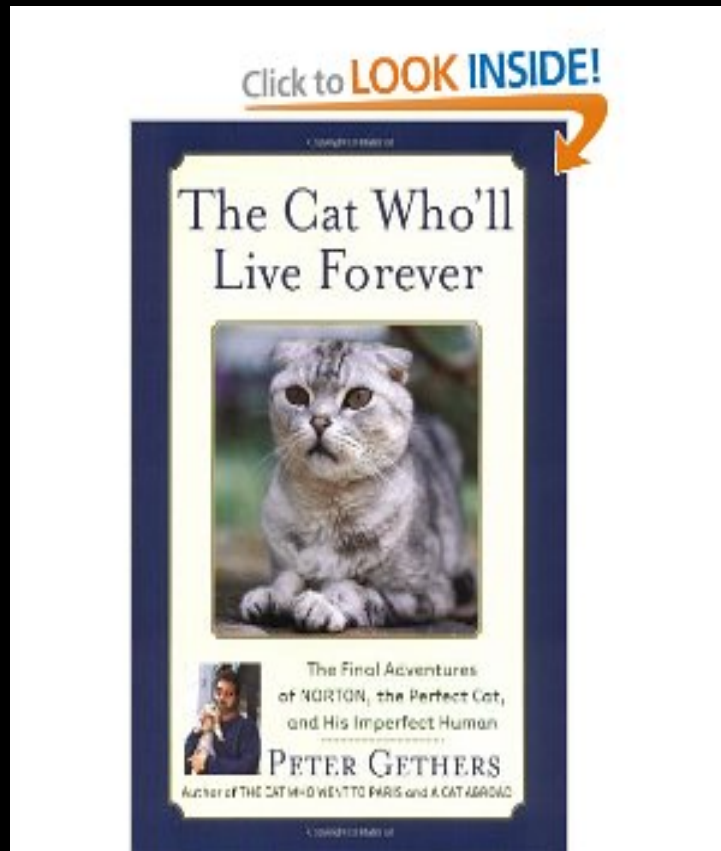
# BOUND FEET AND WESTERN DRESS

- The memoirs that relate the stories of Chang Yu-i's life and her struggles to reconcile Chinese tradition and modern Western society.





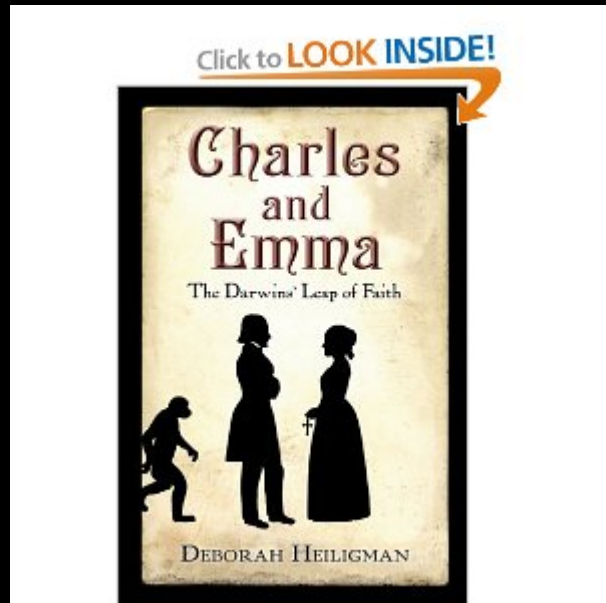
# THE CAT WHO'LL LIVE FOREVER



- This book chronicles the final adventures Norton, the cat, had while traveling with his human companion, Peter Gethers.

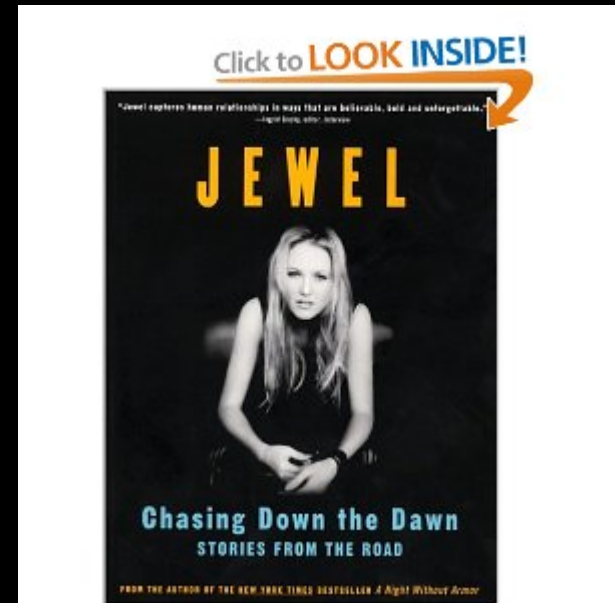
# CHARLES AND EMMA

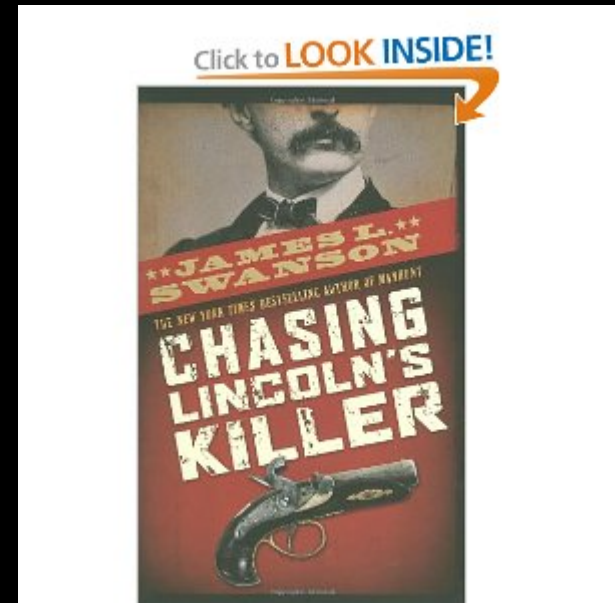
# CHASING DOWN THE DAWN

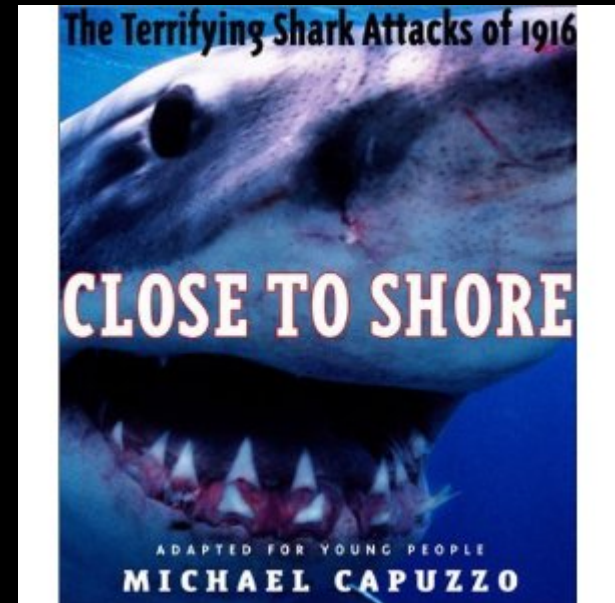
# CHASING LINCOLN'S KILLER

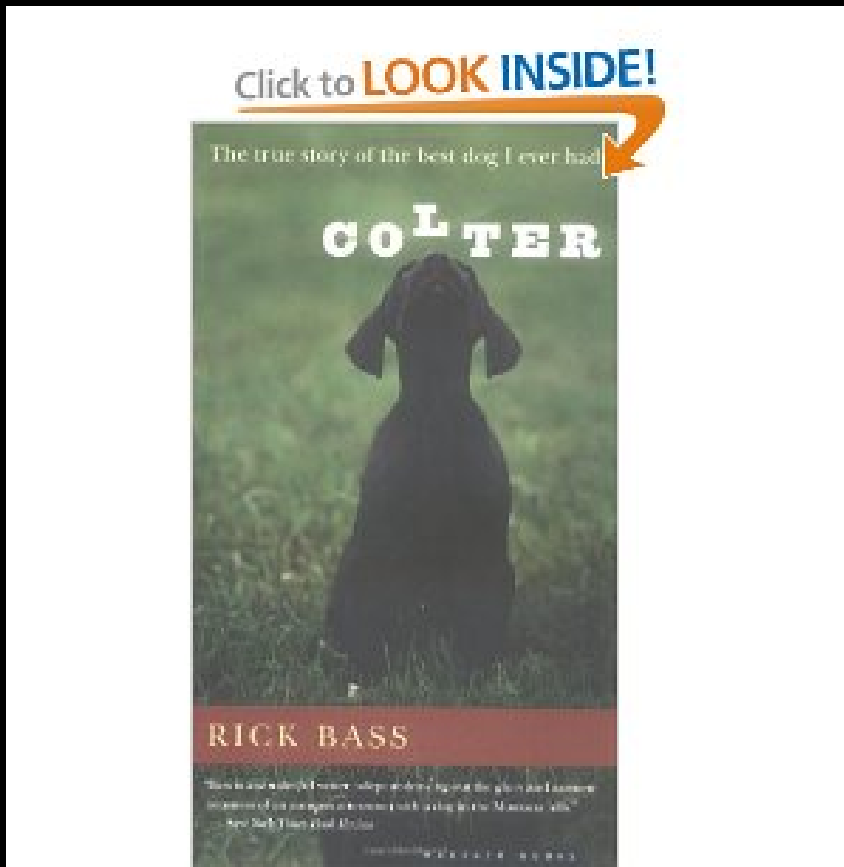


# CLOSE TO SHORE

- This book details the first documented cases in American history of sharks attacking swimmers, which occurred along the Atlantic coast of New Jersey in 1916.



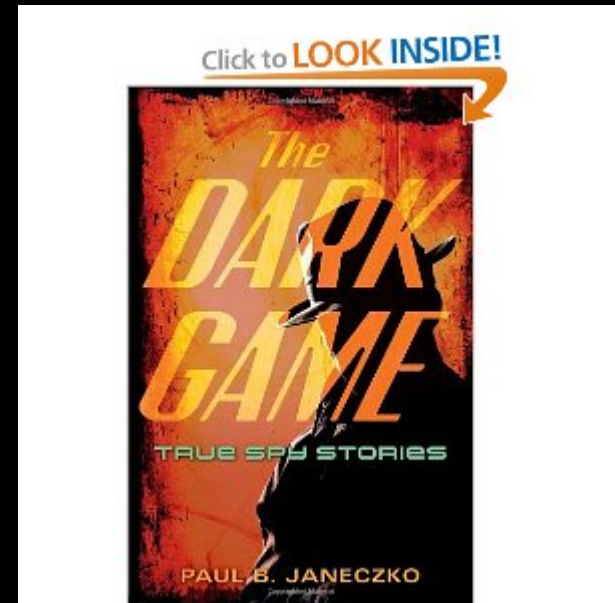

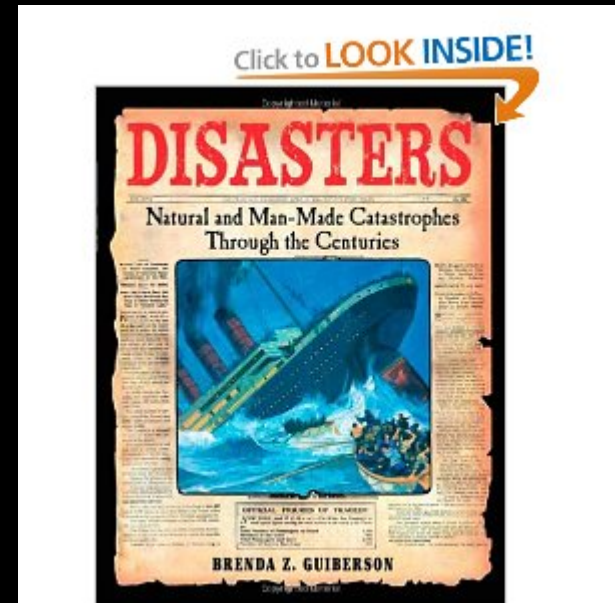
# DIARY OF A WILDERNESS DWELLER



- This is an inspiring story of an independent woman, determined to succeed and prosper in one of British Columbia's most remote areas.

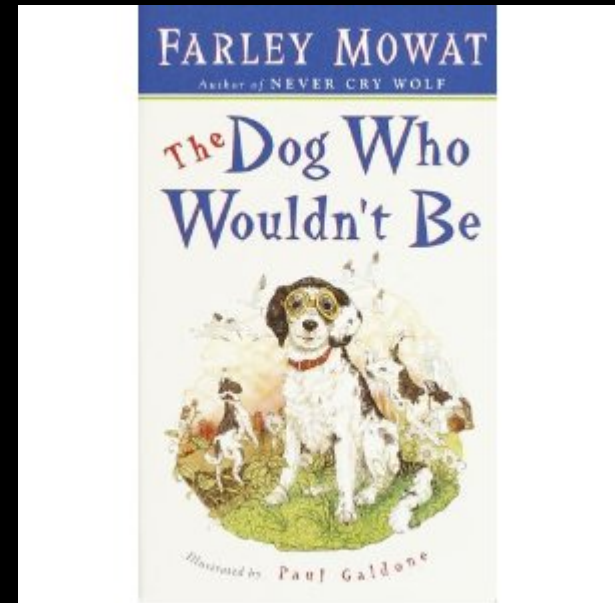
# DISASTERS

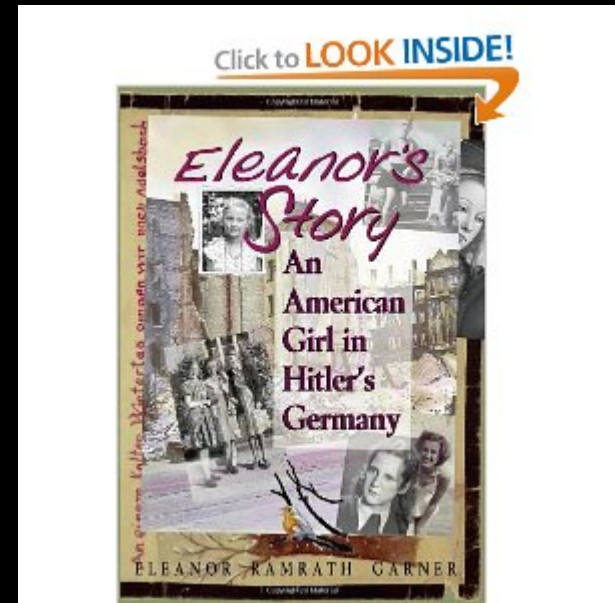

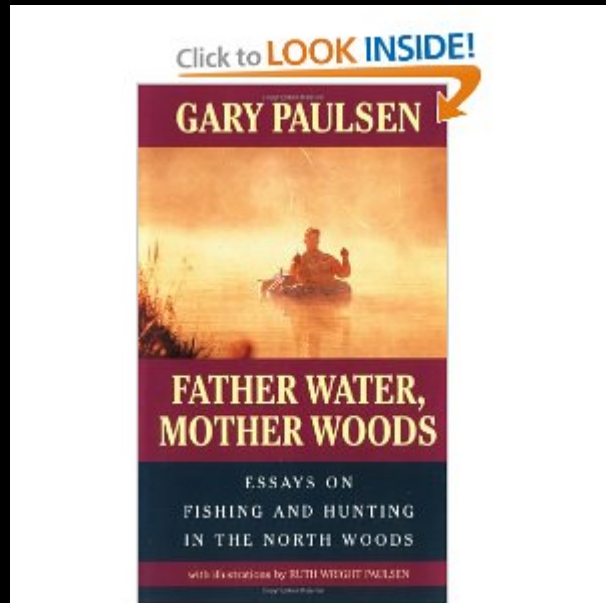

- This is a chilling story of a young American girl and her family and how they survived in Germany during World War II.

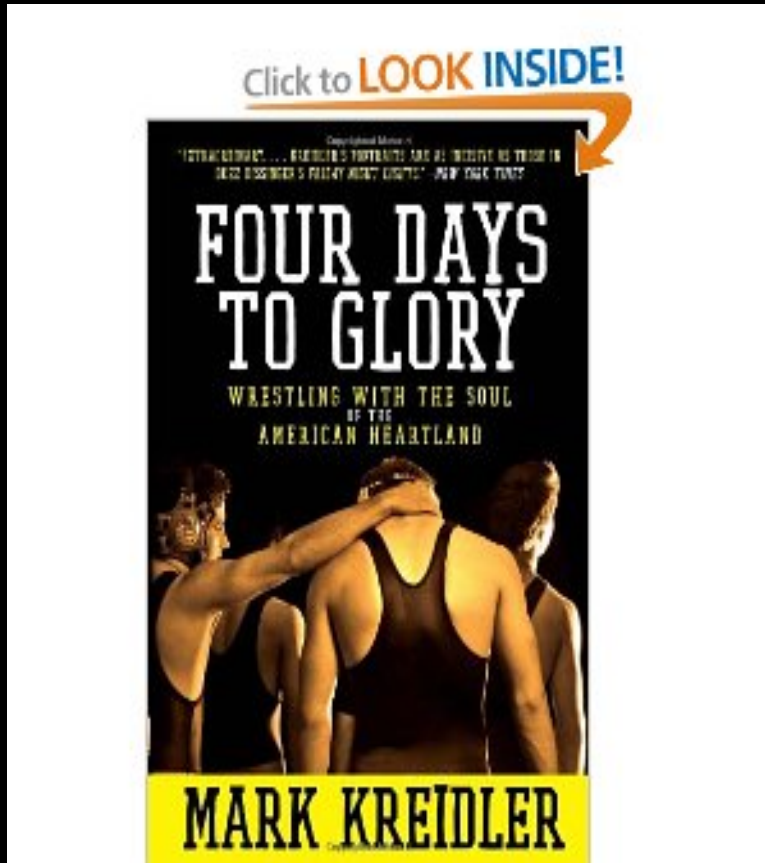


# FATHER WATER, MOTHER WOODS



- Essays recounting the author's adventures in the wilderness, showing us fishing and hunting for pleasure, companionship, and as sources of life's deepest lessons.

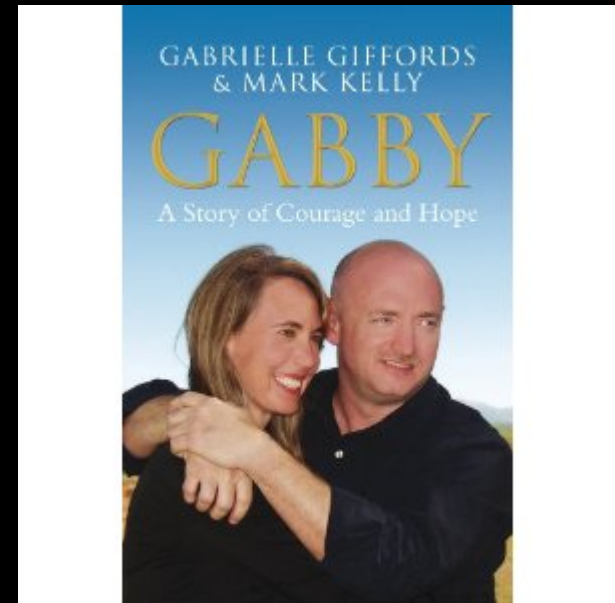
# FOUR DAYS TO GLORY

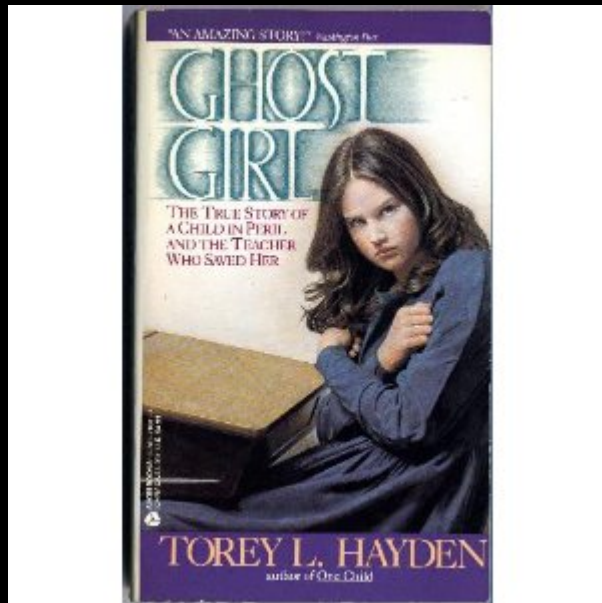

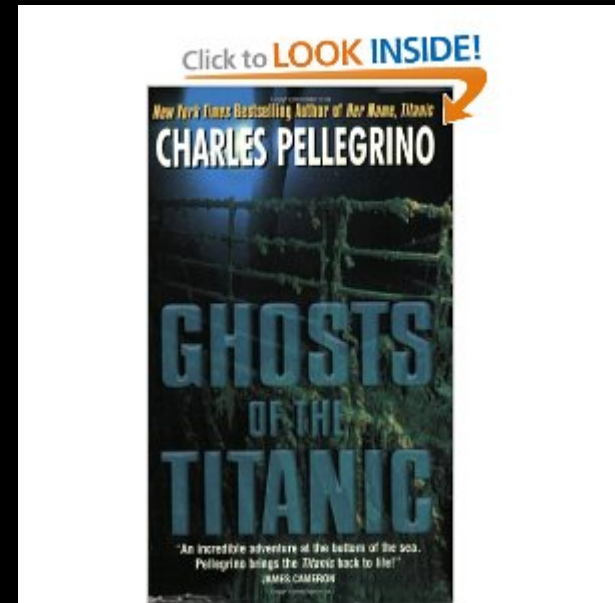
# GHOST GIRL

- True story of a teacher's struggle to unlock the mystery of a young girl's pain and rediscover the child who has been lost to a world far more sinister than anyone could suspect.

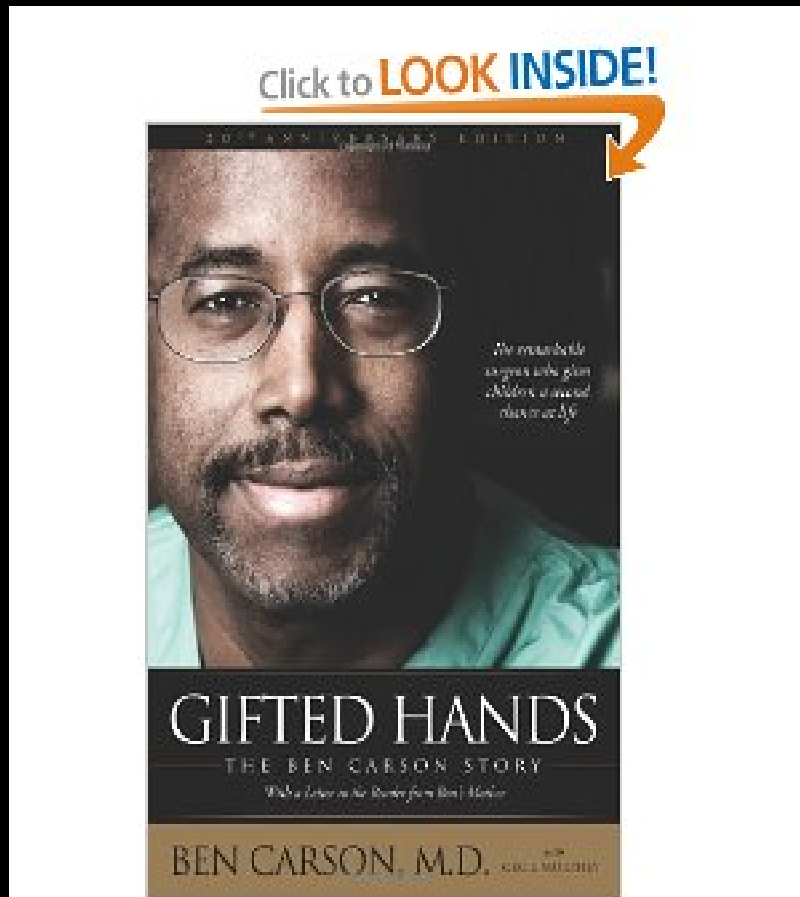

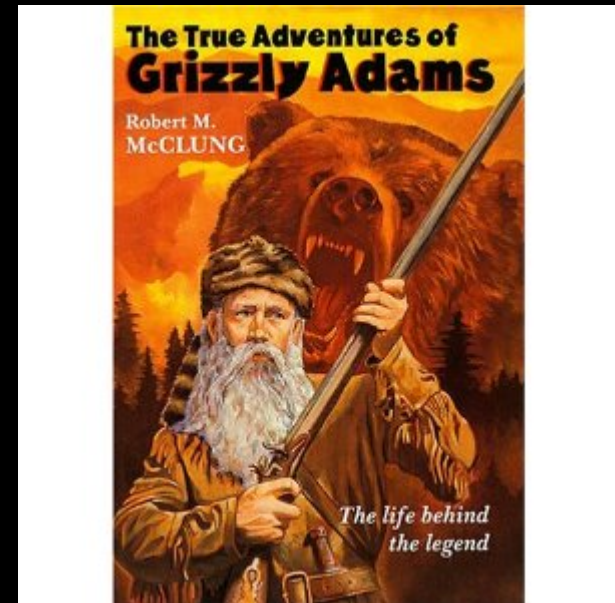
# GRIERSON'S RAID

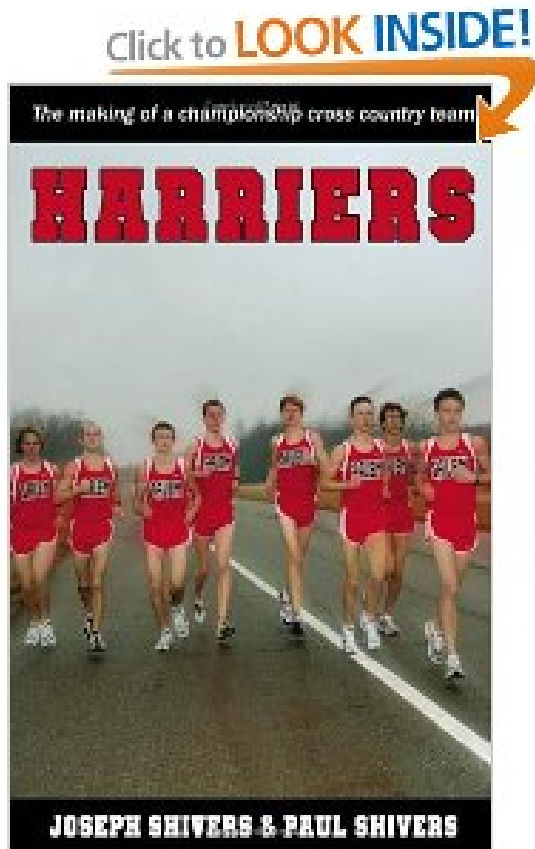


# TRUE ADVENTURES OF GRIZZLY ADAMS

# HARRIERS

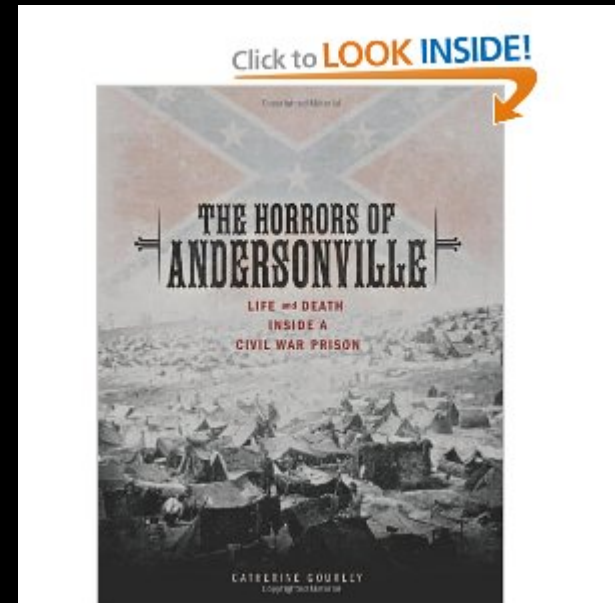

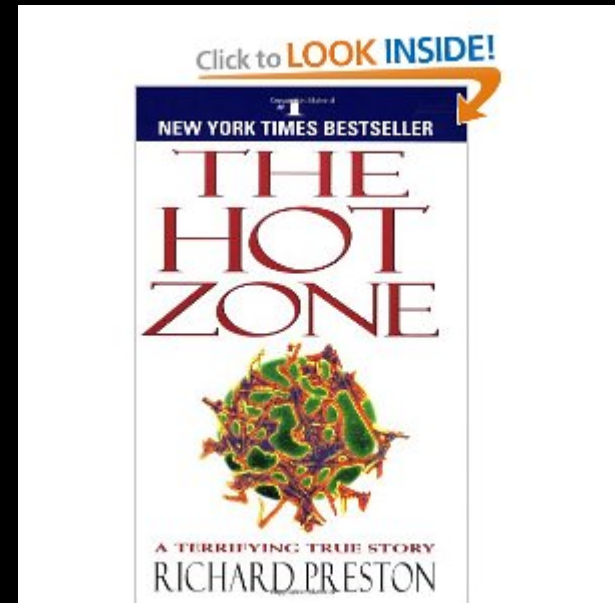
# HORRORS OF ANDERSONVILLE

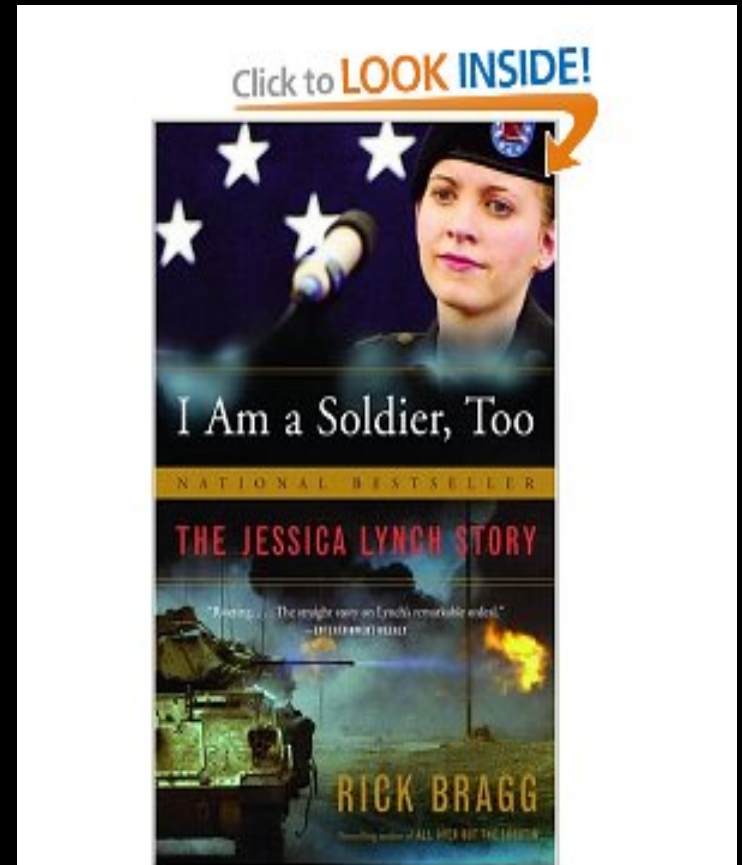
# THE HOT ZONE

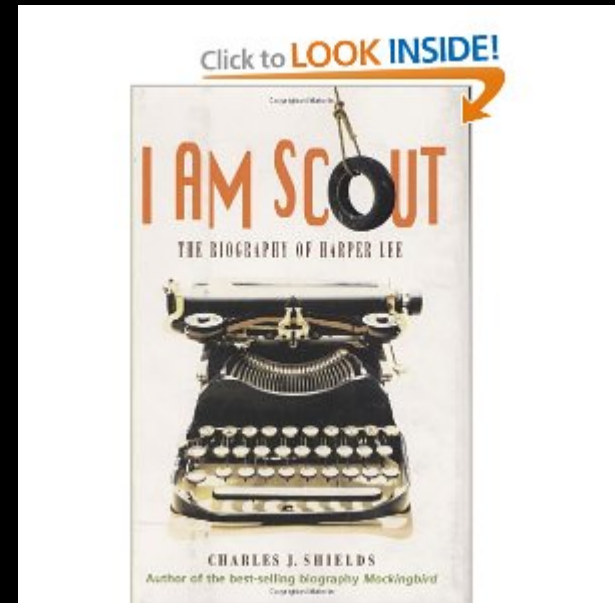
# I AM A SOLDIER, TOO

- Private First Class Jessica Lynch retells the events surrounding her capture by Iraqi soldiers in March 2003, and her rescue by American troops.



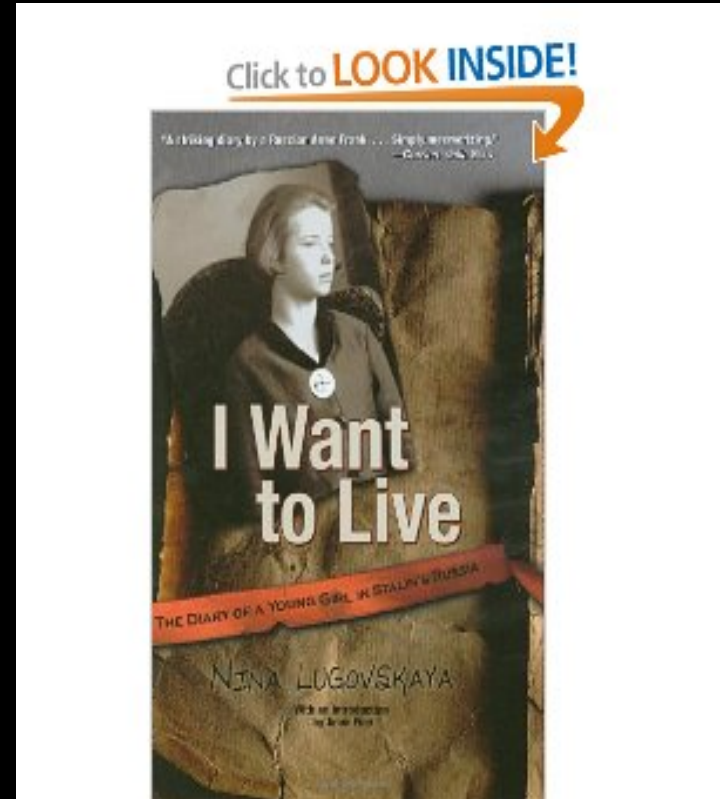
# I AM SCOUT

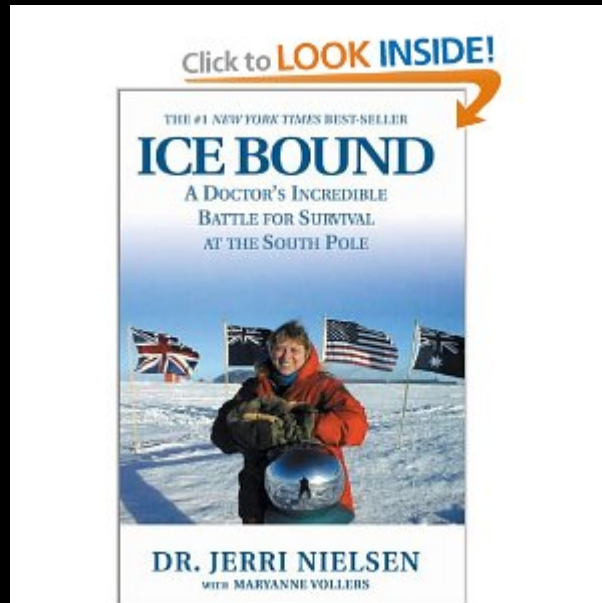
# I WANT TO LIVE

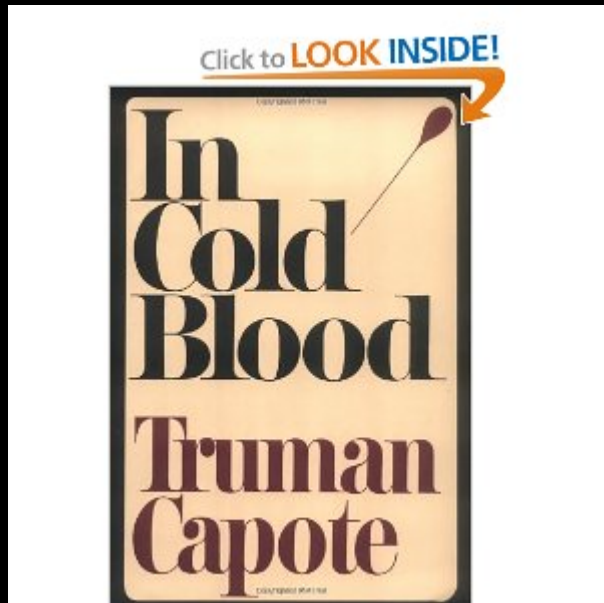


# ICE BOUND

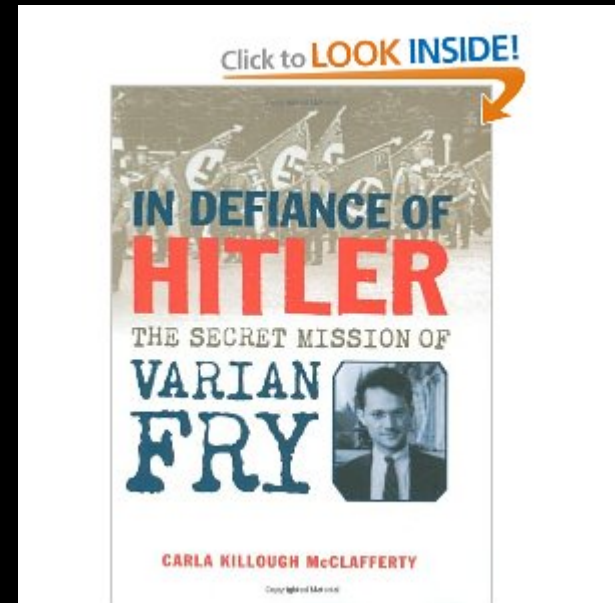
# IN COLD BLOOD



- This book recreates the slaying of the Clutter family of Kansas, and the capture, trial, and execution of their murderers.

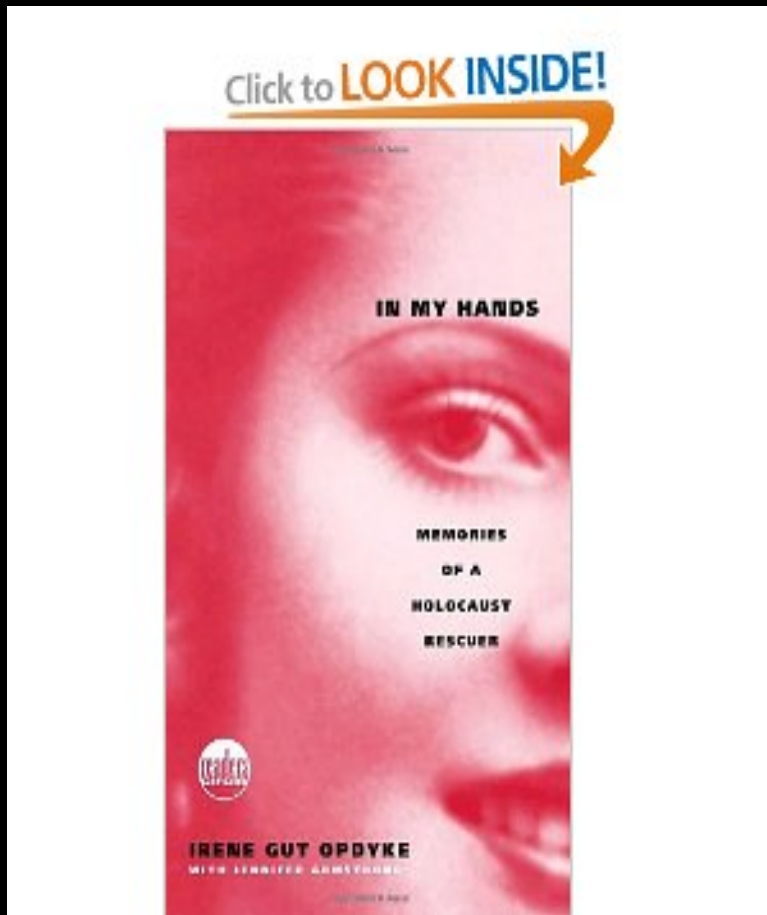
# IN DEFIANCE OF HITLER

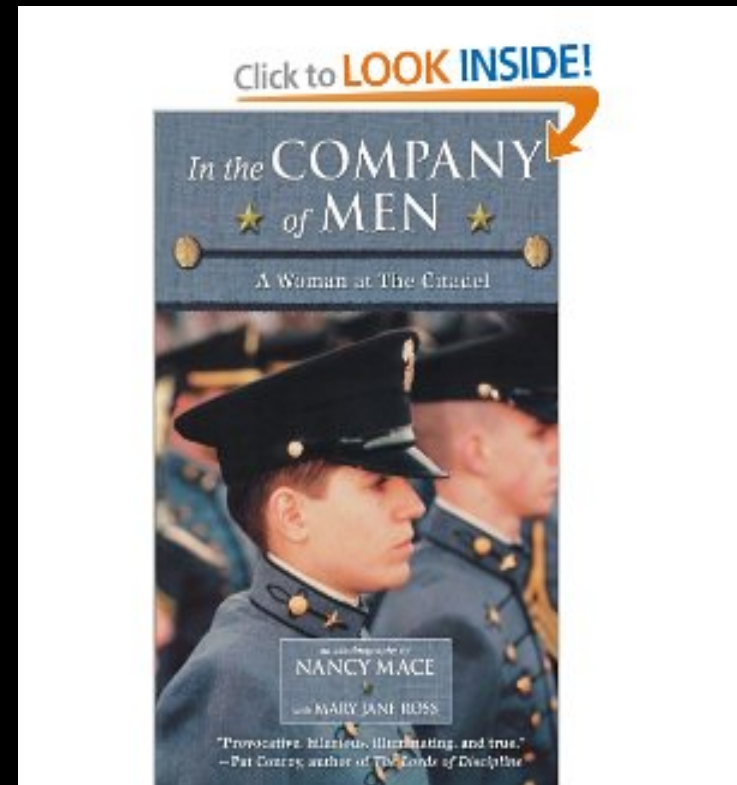
# IN MY HANDS



- This book recounts the experiences of the author who, as a young Polish woman, hid and saved Jews during the Holocaust

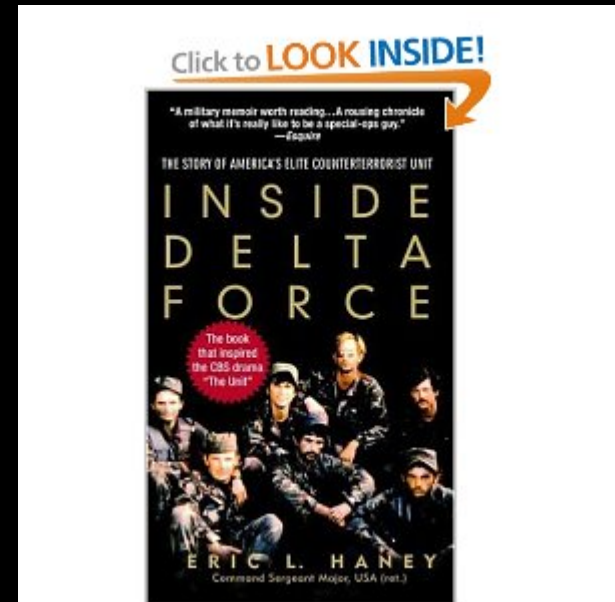
# IN THE COMPANY OF MEN

- This is Nancy Mace's memoir of the great test to become the first female graduate of The Citadel.



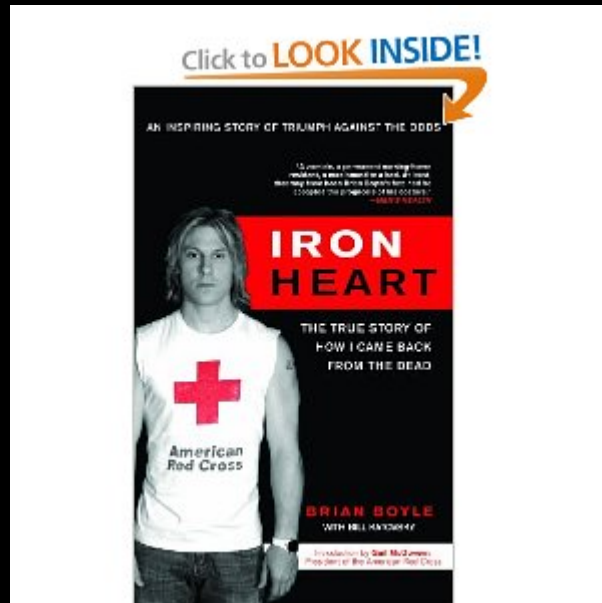
# INSIDE DELTA FORCE

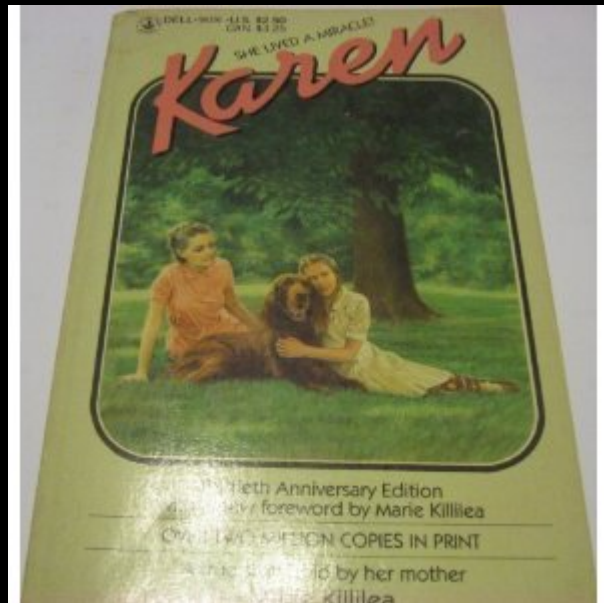


# IRON HEART

- The author details his tragic accident, recovery, and how he was able to bring his body back to a physical state that enabled him to compete in a triathlon in Kona, Hawaii.



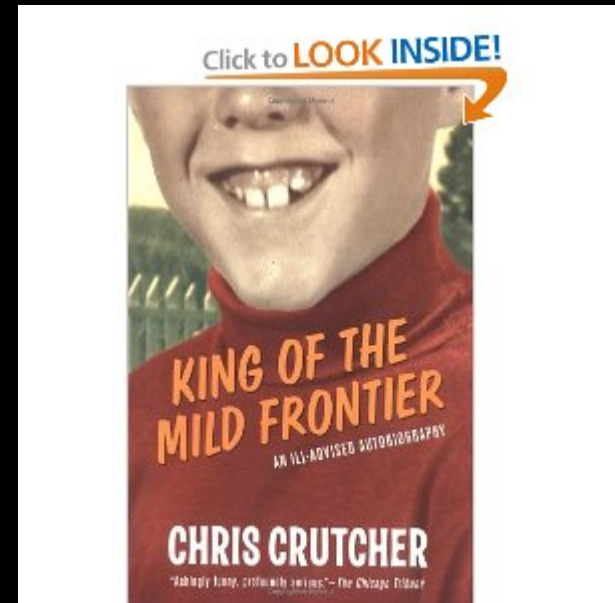
# KAREN



- This is Karen's heartwarming story of her triumphs in a battle against cerebral palsy.

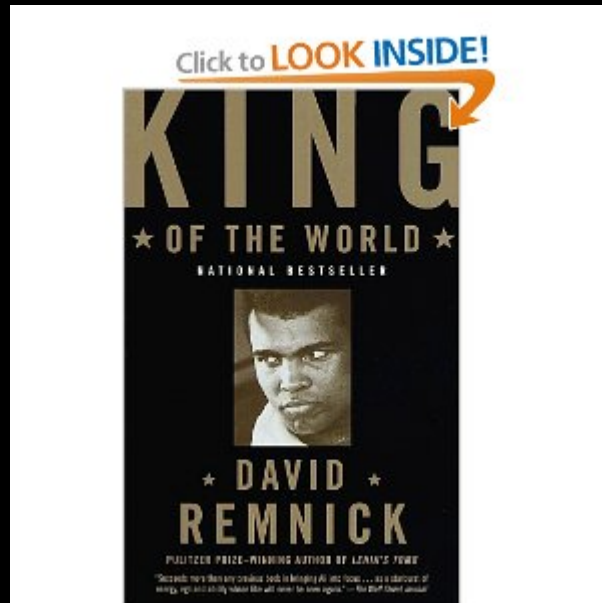
# KING OF THE MILD FRONTIER

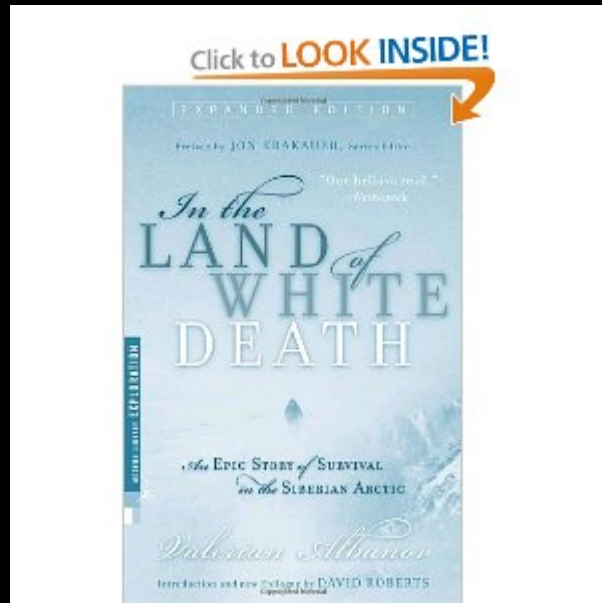


# KING OF THE WORLD

# IN THE LAND OF THE WHITE DEATH

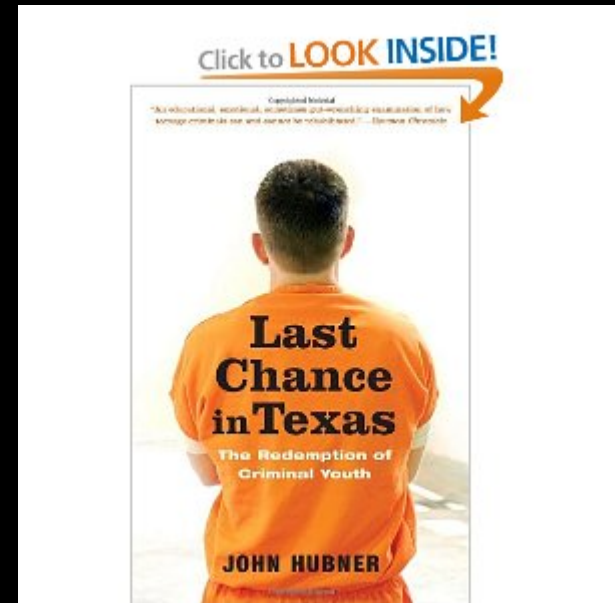
