"We feel this equipment will enable us to not only offer an advanced class but to also offer customized training in PLC's," said Richard, adding, "Jim Thomas (CVCC's PLC instructor) already has several of his former students interested in taking the class."

Six months ago, Dominic Barreca of Pulsar contacted CVCC informing Richard of its Education Donation program, and after the initial contact, CVCC is now the beneficiary of more than \$5,200 worth of equipment including five Unitronics Vision 570 Color 0 (Operator Interface) PLC's and five Snap-in I/O (Input/Output) modules. The PLC's from Unitronics include an integral HMI (Human Machine Interface) as well as onboard I/O - all configured in a single programming environment.
