We love to celebrate birthdays with your child! Each teacher has fun ways to celebrate. Your child may choose to bring a birthday treat to share with the class, but please communicate with your child's teacher if you intend to bring a treat... Balloons, banners, stuffed animals are best saved for home.

## Entering and Exiting School Procedures

To help students be able to socially distance between grade levels and to create a safe and calm entry and dismissal, grade levels will be assigned specific entrances and exits that they will use before and after school. We are asking parents and guardians to please exit school grounds safely and in a timely manner during pick up and drop off to keep the number of people around the building to a minimum. We also want to remind parents and guardians to not enter the playground before school or at any time during the school day to keep our students and campus safe.

Our playgrounds will not be open before or after school for recess or play. When students arrive at school they need to go line up by their assigned zone and they will be welcomed into the building by El Puente staff. Please have your child arrive at school as close to 8:25 am as possible, this will help us with reducing opportunities for students to intermix with students outside of their grade level.

Note that we will be using the same zones in the morning for drop off that we used last year. Please see the picture below to see where your children will wait for the bell to come in at 8:30.

### Pick Up Line Procedures Dismissal

Each family will be provided 2 Pick Up Tags (more available upon request) to use when picking up your student from school either in your car or at the sidewalk. Please reference <u>this video</u> and <u>written instructions</u> on the El Puente Drop Off and Pick Up procedures.

If you have someone who is not used to picking up, please notify the office, make sure they watch this video and have a Pick Up Tag. <u>If you need to get out of your car to help your</u> <u>child for any reason during pick up, please use the parking lot instead</u>.



# Lunch in Classrooms

Students will eat their lunch within their classrooms. Students will have the same amount of time to eat as they previously did and will enjoy additional recess minutes during lunch to help increase physical activity and movement in their day.

Students have a snack mid-morning in most grades. They have a short break and can grab it from their locker / backpack. We do not allow pop, Gatorade, etc in our classrooms on the carpet. We will have water bottle fillers throughout the building. We highly encourage students to bring water bottles for use throughout the day. *Teachers will send specific information home the first week of class if there are allergies that impact food options, it is very important for the safety of all of our students that you are respectful of these guidelines.* 

Students can order hot lunch each morning. There are 2 choices each day. Or students can bring a cold lunch from home. This year lunch and breakfast is **NOT free** for all students. We do encourage families to still fill out the <u>Free and Reduced</u> <u>Lunch application</u> because it helps provide additional funding to our school and district.

This year our food service program also is using **an App called NutriSlice** to help families be able to quickly find menu and nutritional information.

### Communication Between Home and School

A school wide newsletter gets sent home twice monthly. Teachers also send home classroom newsletters with specific homeroom information. At any time, you are encouraged to call or email the office, 616-777-6531, <u>lgingerich@jpsonline.org</u> or your child's teacher. Our expectation is a response within 48 hours (weekends are the exception).

We also have an active facebook page managed by the parent club (Padres del Puente).

# Playground

For safety, and to ensure we are following guidelines for before and after school care licensing our school playground will be closed before and after school. Students will not be allowed to play on the playground in the morning before school and will be asked to leave school at the end of the day.

Students will be given at least two recesses on our playground daily. Their lunch recess will be 40 minutes to provide time for physical activity.

When Should I Keep My Child Home?

If a student has a temperature 100.4 degrees or higher they should be out of school until they are fever free for at least 24 hours (without using medication). Similarly, if your child has vomited or had diarrhea they should be out of school for 24 hours after symptoms subside. If a child has any respiratory illness symptoms, or gastrointestinal illness symptoms they should remain out of school until they are symptom free.
