GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

First - Cover the Basics

Complete Courses

Take and earn a state minimum of 20 credits in specific subjects.

English language arts	4 credits
Health	1/2 credit
Mathematics	4 credits
Physical education	1/2 credit
Science	3 credits
Social studies	3 credits
Electives	5 credits

Other Requirements

You also must receive instruction in economics and financial literacy and complete at least two semesters of fine arts. Your district may require more than 20 credits to graduate.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Second - Show Competency

LHS – Each student must earn a passing score on the Ohio High School Algebra I and English II tests. After taking these tests, there are three additional ways to show competency!

Show evidence that you have signed a contract to enter a branch of the U.S. armed services upon graduation.

Earn credit for one college-level math and/or college-level English course through Ohio's free College Credit Plus program.

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Attendance Every day Counts!

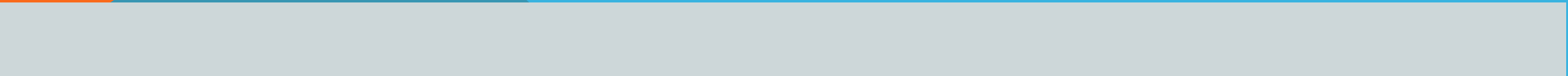
- ❖ You are expected to be present and on time each day

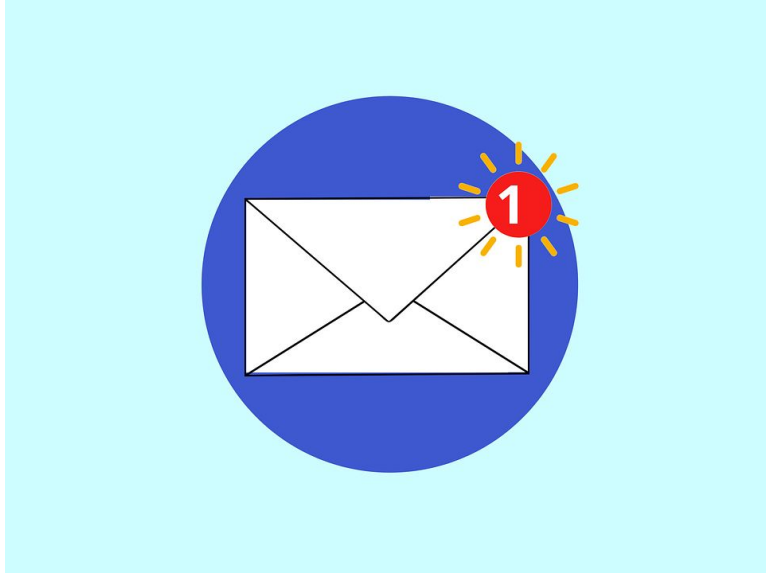
