


VOLLEYBALL



HURRICANE IAN MADE LANDFALL IN FLORIDA ON WEDNESDAY, SEPT. 28 AS A CATEGORY 4 STORM. CURRENTLY, THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE ARE WITHOUT POWER AFTER THE STORM HIT AND 109 DEATHS HAVE BEEN REPORTED (4 IN NORTH CAROLINA). THE WORST OF THE DAMAGE HAS BEEN IN THE FORT MYERS AREA. AS THE HURRICANE LEFT PARTS OF FLORIDA FLOODED, IT CONTINUED ON AND HIT NEAR GEORGETOWN, SOUTH CAROLINA AS A CATEGORY 1 STORM; THE FIRST LANDFALL THE STATE HAD SEEN IN NEARLY 6 YEARS.

RECIPES

EGG NOODLES



INGREDIENTS

2 ¹/₂ CUPS ALL-PURPOSE FLOUR

1 PINCH SALT

2 EGGS, BEATEN

¹∕₂ CUP MILK

1 TABLESPOON BUTTER

STEPS

STEP 1- STIR FLOUR AND SALT TOGETHER IN A LARGE BOWL. ADD EGGS, MILK, AND BUTTER **STEP 2- KNEAD DOUGH UNTIL SMOOTH, ABOUT 5** MINUTES. LET REST IN A **COVERED BOWL.ADD** EGGS, MILK AND BUTTER. **STEP 3- ON A FLOURED** SURFACE, ROLL DOUGH **OUT ONTO A THICKNESS** OF 1/8 TO 1/4 INCH. CUT INTO DESIRED LENGTHS AND SHAPES. **STEP 4- ALLOW TO AIR DRY BEFORE COOKING, 10-15** MINUTES. **STEP 5- COOK NOODLES IN** A LARGE POT OF SALTED **BOILING WATER UNTIL AL DENTE, ABOUT 5 MINUTES.**

PUMPKIN ROLL



INGREDIENTS

⅔ TEASPOON GROUND CLOVES
¾ TEASPOON OF SALT
3 LARGE EGGS
1 CUP GRANULATED SUGAR
⅔ CUP OF PURE PUMPKIN
1 CUP WALNUTS, CHOPPED (OPTIONAL)
1 PACKAGE (8 OUNCES) CREAM CHEESE
AT ROOM TEMPERATURE
1 CUP POWDERED SUGAR, SIFTED
6 TABLESPOONS BUTTER OR
MARGARINE, SOFTENED
1 TEASPOON VANILLA EXTRACT
1 CUP POWDERED SUGAR (OPTIONAL FOR AESTHETIC)

STEPS

STEP 1- PREHEAT THE OVEN TO 375D. GREASE PAN; LINE WITH WAX PAPER. GREASE AND FLOUR PAPER. SPRINKLE A COTTON TOWEL WITH 1/4 CUP POWDERED SUGAR.

STEP 2- COMBINE FLOUR, BAKING POWDER, BAKING SODA, CINNAMON, CLOVES AND SALT IN A SMALL BOWL. ADD EGGS AND GRANULATED SUGAR IN A LARGE BOWL UNTIL THICK. BEAT IN PUMPKIN. STIR IN FLOUR MIXTURE. SPREAD INTO THE PREPARED PAN. SPRINKLE WITH NUTS.

STEP 3- BAKE FOR 14 MINUTES. IMMEDIATELY LOOSEN AND TURN THE CAKE ONTO THE PREPARED TOWEL. CAREFULLY PEEL OFF PAPER. ROLL UP THE CAKE AND TOWEL TOGETHER, STARTING WITH THE NARROW END. COOL ON A WIRE RACK.

STEP 4- BEAT CREAM CHEESE, 1 CUP POWDERED SUGAR, BUTTER AND VANILLA EXTRACT IN A SMALL MIXER BOWL UNTIL SMOOTH. UNROLL THE CAKE. SPREAD CREAM CHEESE MIXTURE OVER CAKE. REROLL CAKE. WRAP IN PLASTIC WRAP AND REFRIGERATE FOR AT LEAST ONE HOUR. SPRINKLE WITH POWDERED SUGAR BEFORE SERVING, IF DESIRED.
