Celebrating the Class of 2026

Greene County Career Center proudly honored the Class of 2026 during its Senior Recognition Ceremony held May 12 at the Wright State University Nutter Center. This year, 448 students completed their career-technical programs, collectively earning more than 2,500 industry credentials to support their future education and career goals. Students also demonstrated the value of hands-on learning through work-based experiences, with approximately 50% of students earning more than 250 hours of professional experience while working with more than 150 local businesses. Together, work-based learning students contributed over 165,000 hours and added more than \$2 million back into the local economy. The ceremony also recognized academic excellence, including 129 seniors selected for the Greene County Career Center Chapter of the National Technical Honor Society. In addition, GCCC students earned more than \$3 million in scholarships this year. The event celebrated the dedication and perseverance of the graduating class as they prepare to take the next step toward their futures.

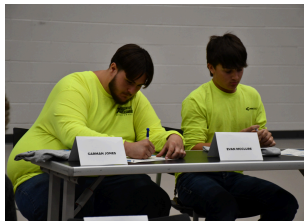

Final Exam Information

GCCC will hold junior final exams on 5/20/26 and 5/21/2026. Students will follow a modified schedule on both days that includes exam periods, review time, and lunch.

EXEMPTIONS:

- Students MAY, at their teacher's discretion, be exempt from a final - please communicate with teachers if you have questions.

EXPECTATIONS for Arrival and Dismissal:

- Once students arrive on campus for the day, they are expected to stay until all testing is completed for the day. There is no "come and go" policy between exams.
 - If a student has a testing period with no exam, they will report to the Cafeteria to wait until their next exam.
- If a student only has a later afternoon exam, they may arrive at the start of that testing period.
- Students who finish an exam early must remain in the classroom until the scheduled transition time.
- Students who plan to drive themselves do not need a permission slip to leave after they have completed their exams
 - Students who finish exams and leave early must CHECK out in the office.

LUNCH:

- Lunch will be available as scheduled.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

- Students with testing accommodations will receive extended time and support based on their IEP or 504 plan.

MAKE UP EXAMS:

- Students needing to make up an exam must have a doctor's note or administrator approval.
- Students would then schedule with Mrs. Hunter the Director, to make up exams on the following days and times:
 - Tuesday, 5/26/2026 7:45 A.M.-2:00 P.M.
 - Wednesday, 5/27/2026 7:45 A.M.-2:00 P.M.

GCCC Laptop and Yondr Pouch Collection

All students are to turn in their laptop (computer, cord/charger, case) and Yondr Pouch.

Starting 5/19/2026, Juniors turn in laptops and Yondr Pouches to Room 2122 after all Final Exams are completed.
