#### Comments:

Cheryl Long submits compliance documents to us as Sponsor via Epicenter for all TGFS (The Graham Family of Schools). Epicenter is the online compliance repository for all required documents by the Sponsor and the Ohio Department of Education. The compliance rate is at 100%. Documents cover governance, academic, fiscal, and operational requirements for both

the school and governing authority. She is very conscientious and ensures proper submissions for TGS as well as the other TGFS. There are many intricacies involved with compliance due to changes in law, Ohio Department of Education requirement changes, and the detail of each requirement. We ask all those that Cheryl must gather documentation from to continue to work with her because some dates in Epicenter have no room for adjustment due to statutory requirements. The school has been very consistent in this area from year to year.

<u>Comments</u>: TGS is in priority status of school improvement and will complete the Ohio Improvement Process. Due to being the Operator of two other schools, financial stability is monitored and has improved. Special education is also monitored as it was one of the areas placing the school into priority status.

## Areas of Improvement:

- School Improvement Plan timelines will be followed for the goals mentioned earlier. Plan is a 3 year process and is ongoing. The school has a designation of Priority in the Ohio School Improvement Process. I have completed the spring monitoring and will schedule multiple visits for monitoring during the 2019-2020 school year. SST 11 Consultant will also complete monitoring.
- Disciplinary due process timeline needs improvement. We will schedule a meeting with deans and determine ways to improve together before the end of the 2018-2019 school year.

## 3. Financial Plan

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<u>Comments</u>: All fiscal reports have been submitted on time for the school year. Alan Hutchinson has conducted monthly reviews and all is documented in Epicenter. We remind the school to be aware of the upcoming spring submission of the five-year forecast in Epicenter. The template has been updated for spring. We appreciate the detailed fiscal reports that are given in multiple formats. Treasurer Jen Smith has been a great addition. The Graham School serves as the Operator for The Graham Family of Schools and employs all of the staff for each school. This creates greater liability for the school. All documents have been successfully submitted related to their management responsibilities.

<u>Comments</u>: Enrollment has been consistent, but dipping slightly over two years. As a review, enrollment in January of 2016 was 263; January of 2017 was 248; January of 2018 was 240; 2018 Spring Visit was 244; 2019 Spring Site Visit was 246.

<u>Areas of Strength</u> - We thank Cheryl and Cathy for their continued efficiency during site visits as well as Cheryl's prompt submission to Epicenter. We realize that there have been a great deal of changes with the sponsor evaluation and are appreciative of the cooperation shown by staff. Leaders from both schools are always very open to dialogue and discuss any issue that arises. We would like to commend the governing authorities for approving all of the needed updates as well as the schools for instituting new procedures as a result of the many changes. The school staffs also show great compassion for the students with high needs.
