It's that time of year again. The Van Wert Elks Lodge No. 1197 is proud to sponsor again this year our Student/Volunteer of the Month Award. Volunteerism is a big part of this award. However, I also realize that many students also must **work** in order to help support themselves and many times their families. This will definitely be taken into consideration.

Note: Students **must** indicate the amount of time (in hours) they have spent on each activity that they list. This year I am also including a volunteer/work table example that may help in their documentation. Students that win at the state level seem to use the table example—just an FYI.

The awards will start in November—but I will be awarding two (2) for the month of October as well (backdating). October through April we will select 2 students per month. Each winner will receive a Certificate of Achievement and then a monetary award at the banquet. A breakfast will be held in the spring to honor the monthly winners and announce our Student/Volunteer of the Year. The Student/Volunteer of the Year will receive a certificate and a monetary award with the possibility of being selected by the District as our District's Volunteer of the Year (\$1000).

Nominees will be judged on the basis of multiple achievements—1) Community Service, 2) Work Experience, 3) Honors and Awards, 4) Leadership, 5) Extracurricular Activities, and any other noteworthy experiences. **Grades are NOT as important as the achievements; therefore, you do not need to send transcripts.** Many times applicants use their resumes—that is fine; but, they need to <u>indicate the amount of time that was given for each activity</u>. Again, the Volunteer/Work Table may be helpful. Students should include a letter(s) of recommendation from teachers, principals, or others. In a separate file I have the application form, a letter to the student, and table forms to be used by the students. We are asking you, the guidance counselor(s), to get the word out so that your worthy students may be selected and nominated for this award.

NOTE: Please have your students fill the application out on the computer and **save** all parts that they are sending me. I still would like to have the applications submitted to me on **hard** copy (paper); however, the winner that will be submitted for the \$1000 must be sent on-line to our district chair.

I am asking that you have your applications in to me by <u>October 30</u>. I would like to have the other months sent to me by the **first week of that month being awarded**. To make it easier for you, if you would like to submit the bulk of your students in your October batch, go ahead. I will look at previously submitted applications as well as any others that I may receive for future months' awards.
