A message from our Head of School:



i3 Families,

School is in full swing! These past few weeks have been some of our most challenging to date with the spike in Delta cases, but we continue to press forward, facing these challenges with resilience.

Starting September 15th, we will begin celebrating Latin American and Hispanic Heritage Month. During this time, we recognize the many Latin American and Hispanic families and employees who add to the richness of our i3 family. We celebrate the many languages, histories, and cultures that make up the Latin American and Hispanic community at large.

Recently, we announced that third grade teacher Mr. Nathaniel Dunn will represent i3 Academy in the Alabama Charter School Commission's Teacher of the Year Program. Mr. Dunn embodies what it means to be an agent of change as a teacher and a citizen. He continually looks for ways to improve his craft and empowers his students to be the best versions of themselves each day. Way to go, Mr. Dunn!

Our recent COVID survey for families revealed that one third of our i3 families would prefer a remote learning option at this time. We have done our best to respond to this request as well as consider the high rate of community spread. We are offering a temporary remote learning option from September 20-October 7. Students who choose this option will return to school on October 12, 2021. For more information, please see page five of the newsletter. In order to register for the temporary remote learning option, parents must sign a parent contract. Please read this document carefully as this remote option will be different from the one offered in 2020-2021. Register and sign through <u>this link</u>.

If you or someone you know is available to substitute, we would greatly appreciate the help. The hours are 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the elementary school and 7:15 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. at the middle school. The pay is \$125 per day. Once you apply, your name will be added to our substitute pool, and we will contact you if a need arises. At that time, you can accept or decline the job for that day.

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Student recruitment will be here before we know it! Applications for the lottery open on October 1st. We are adding a seventh grade class with twenty-five additional seats. Please spread the word to your friends and family. To apply, starting on October 1st, go to our website i3Academy.org. Current families do not need to reapply, but if your i3 student has a younger sibling that you would like to enroll for next school year, you will need to complete an application before the deadline, January 17, 2022.

Please mark your calendars for parent conferences on Friday, October 29th. This will be a time for you to meet with your child's teacher via Zoom. Students will not have school on this day. Your child's teacher will send additional information as the date approaches.

In closing, we must continue to work through the challenges of COVID-19 as a team. Every decision we make affects the larger group, including wearing masks and getting vaccinated. Please consider getting your COVID-19 vaccine and encourage your child to wear his/her mask properly each day. We have another vaccine clinic in the works--stay tuned!



Temporary Remote Learning Option Overview

We are offering a temporary remote learning option from September 20-October 7. Students in this option will return to school on October 12, 2021. Any decision to continue the remote option will be made closer to October 7th and will be based on community COVID-19 numbers at that point in time. We will give families some advance notice if we plan to continue this option.

Registration will be available from September 10th-16th. Any registrations after Thursday, September 16, will not be accepted.

In order to register for the temporary remote learning option, parents sign a parent contract. Please read this document carefully as this remote option will be different from the one offered in 2020-2021. Register and sign through this <u>link</u>.

At this time, remote learning will be 90% asynchronous. In other words, students will be required to complete the majority of the assigned work independently. There will not be live instruction through Zoom for the core academic content. Please consider whether this is a fit for your child academically.

Remote learning will include the following, but it may vary slightly based on your child's individual teacher:

- Assignments and lessons will be asynchronous, meaning live lessons on Zoom will NOT be part of remote learning at this time. It will be mostly computer or paper-based activities and lessons.
- A digital "Week at a Glance" will be given for students to complete throughout the week.
- A short weekly check-in with the child's teacher as a whole group will be offered via Zoom.
- Attendance will be based on assignment completion. After two or more consecutive days or four days total of missing assignments, the student will be asked to return to school on campus.
- An iPad and headphones will be provided for remote learning
- Food service for the week will be provided; meal kits will need to be picked up at the school or a bus hub location (TBD)
- Intervention, special education, or gifted services will be offered as applicable.



MR. MICHAEL JOHNSON MUSIC TEACHER


STAFF SPOTLIGHT:


We're so glad to have Mr. Johnson on the team, and we can't wait for our students gain a love of music and performing arts.

Merci Suárez Changes Gears by Meg Medina


