What is a charter school?

- Tuition-free, public school
- Allows families to choose where to send their children.
- Admits students based on a random selection process if more students attempt to enroll for admission than can be accommodated.
- Ability to make decisions regarding personnel, scheduling, curriculum, and instruction.
- Governed by an independent governing board that is a tax-exempt organization.
- Established and operated under the terms of a charter contract between governing board and chartering authorizer.


MR. BO GARRETT

Bo Garrett grew up in Florence, Alabama. He attended Birmingham-Southern College, while simultaneously serving in the United States Marine Corps Reserves. Mr. Garrett started his graduate work at the University of Alabama. From Tuscaloosa, he went to Washington, D.C. where he worked for the National Geographic Society's Education Foundation. In the aftermath of 9/11, he returned to Alabama and accepted a position teaching fourth and fifth grade at Highlands School in Birmingham. In 2010, he transitioned to Highlands' middle school.
