Prodigy:

This is a math site the students can use as additional skill practice. I encourage your child to spend no more than 20 minutes a day on this site.

Writing:

Part of the packet you picked up for your child including "At Home Learning: Writing Every Day" writing prompts. Please make sure your child is working on writing every day. There are 18 writing prompts. Your child should have **TEN** different writings completed by April 3. The students are aware that I am wanting at least five sentences or more in their writings. They are not allowed to begin a sentence with the words "I" or "And". Always remind them of C.O.P.S (capitalization, organization, punctuation, and spelling).

Reading:

A reading log went home with your child. Anything you read, baggy books, the books I sent home, or books you already own at home can go on this log as long as the student read the story (with guidance if needed).

Lexia: I encourage your child to spend no more than 20 minutes on Lexia a day. I sent home all login info. Feel free to message me if you cannot get logged in. The student is required to complete the Lexia assignments independently, with no help from parents.

There are many additional resources I will continue to share on our Class DOJO page throughout this time. Feel free to message me if you need any help or ideas. If the work becomes too hard, allow your child plenty of "brain breaks" to relax and step away for a little bit.
