Dear Third Grade Parents,

Thank you for all of the help you have given to your kids throughout this unique learning experience. Friday, May 15th is material pickup and drop off day from 10-2. This is simply to say have a great summer, take a socially distant end of the year photo with the school bus and your child and send warm well wishes. The bus is tentatively leaving around 10:30 A.M. and we will send updates as we are in route! Yearbooks have not come in yet due to COVID. More details will be provided as we learn them. Grade cards will not be the same as the first three nine weeks. We will be giving a comment summary that is based on the whole year and not just the fourth nine weeks.

We will be returning the journals to you after they have been reviewed and marked with comments. It may take 2-3 weeks for the journals to get back to you. We value the work and effort that has been put into the journals and we want you to be able to keep them as a reminder of this unique learning experience. It will also help and serve as a review with the transition into fourth grade.

It is important to make sure that your child continues to practice his/her multiplication facts, division facts and his/her reading throughout the summer so that he/she begins the fourth grade strong.
