Week Six Science Focus: Mysterious Creatures

creature if you want. I want this to be a fun topic and I am really excited to see what everyone finds out and how they present their argument. Feel free to share your work with your friends if you like.

For the week you will have four assignments. These can be found on Google Classroom. They will all four be posted on Monday and you can work on them all week.

- 1) Watch the Mystery Science video "Are Aliens Real?" and complete the response on Google Classroom.
- 2) Research the Mysterious Creature of your choice. As you research, think about the evidence that you are collecting. Your evidence should support your opinion.
- 3) Create a Google Slide show with what you have learned. Put some creativity into your slide show. You should be getting pretty good at creating slide shows by now. I have given you 4 slides, but you can add as many as you like.
- 4) Post a question on Flipgrid about these mysterious creatures. Then try to respond to at least three other people's questions.

Don't forget to keep working on your Acts of Kindness around the house and for your family. I have gotten a couple of letters from some of you and it has really made me smile! If you do an Act of Kindness, share it with me. If you haven't used your e-mail, it is an easy way to share things with me. You all have your own e-mail and you can find it in your apps.
