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Math

Please complete the following math book lessons this week:

- Complete math book lesson 11.12 on pages 428-429 on symmetry.
 - (This is a very quick lesson.)



- Trail Post #4: Lantern Puzzles - Make sure you look at the math sign in the lantern to see the math operation (+ or x) that you need to use to solve each puzzle box.

- Trail Post #5: Gear Up - (You can trace any shoe if you don't have a hiking shoe.)
 - For the Times Trail Relay Race, the entire trail is equal to one whole. Use a number line split into fourths to help you solve this.

Optional online math practice: Work on Redbird, Khan Academy or Xtramath.com. If you do not have internet access, you can practice your multiplication facts or play a multiplication game with a family member at home. Please write down the dates that you worked on this, the amount of time spent and what you did on a piece of paper to turn in.
