Math Suggestions:

These are math practice games you can do with a deck of cards (remove the Face Cards). Do one activity a day for about 10-15 minutes.

- *More than, less than, same as-for this one you will need to use the ace as a one. Turn over 2 cards and compare them. Example: turn over an ace and a 10 answer would be 1 is less than 10
- *Make ten- turn over 20 cards and find pairs of cards that make a total of ten by counting the shapes on the cards.
- *<u>Patterns</u>- use the cards to make patterns. Example: red, black, red, black 5,4,5,4,5,4 diamond, heart
- *<u>Sorting</u>- use 10 cards to sort into piles and then explain or describe how you sorted them. *By color,* shape, number
- *One More- use cards ace-9, count out 10 cards for your draw pile. Turn the other cards face up on the table. Turn over 1 card from your draw pile. Find a card on the table that is 1 more.
- *One Less- play the same as one more only find a card that is 1 less.
- *Number Order- use 1 suit of cards (ex. all spades) and put numbers in order 1-10 (ace for 1).

More suggestions not using a deck of cards:

- *Length- find 6 objects and order by shortest to longest. This can be objects found outside like sticks, rocks, leaves, etc.
- *<u>Heavier/Lighter</u>- take a walk and find objects that are heavier and lighter. *The leaf is lighter than the rock.*
- *Write numbers 1-100
- *Count to 100 by 1's and by 10's
- *Complete chapter 11 in both math workbooks

^{*}Counting on-turn over a card and count on from that number to 50.

^{*}Model numbers-turn over a card and count out that many beans, pennies, candy etc.
