Any time a student who is not present for the learning day, will need to be formally excused by parent/guardian with a written note for all excuses, Per Policy Doctor Excuses, etc. *Verbal excuses provided over the telephone will not be considered excused absence*. Notes can be submitted to our front office and it will be recorded on the students' attendance record for the school year. 3 Days absences will initiate a formal follow up by a letter home/phone call / home visit, by our schools attendance team. I am happy to let you all know we are off to a great start. We will be meeting/ with each grade level, talking with them about ANTI-BULLYING/Harassment. It is a conversation we will be doing with ALL students for the safety and wellbeing of everyone.

#### Some information on BULLYING:

Bullying has been an ongoing issue in many schools over the past decade. Bullying is not only from face-to-face interactions but also through the use of cell phones and the internet. Many students become fearful of going to school due to bullying that may occur on school grounds and off.

#### So what can the school do to help your child?

CCSD has a No Bullying policy. Students are encouraged to tell an adult if bullying is occurring on or off campus grounds. Teachers are on the lookout for signs that students may be bullied and continue to work on having a safe environment for all.

#### What can the parents do to help their student?

As a parent, we encourage you to let the school know if you think your child is being bullied or if they have made a report of bullying. We also encourage you to frequently check cell phones and emails that your student may be receiving from others. This will also allow you to know who your child is speaking with for safety measure as well.

#### How will a parent know if their child is bullied?

If your child has not reported being bullied there may be signs that the child is being bullied. A few of those signs are as follows:

- · Unwillingness to go to school
- Becoming withdrawn
- · Feeling ill in the morning
- · Having nightmares
- · Refusing to talk about what's wrong
- Becoming distressed or anxious

If you believe your child is being bullied, please contact the school for ways to help the situation.

#### Sometimes witnesses can help to stop bullying.

During an attack, bystanders can help change the power by saying a "shutdown statement" to the bully. Doing nothing shows acceptance to the situation. Laughing or smiling makes the bully more powerful.

#### Shutdown Statements:

- That's not nice
- That's just not cool
- That's mean
- · Knock it off

#### **Parent Tips**

- · Listen carefully to your child and don't minimize the pain.
- · Reinforce your love and discuss the lack of respect bullies have for others.
- $\cdot$  Think of some quick, humorous responses your child could use and help
- him/her to role-play (practice) responses.
- · Step in and talk to school authorities.
