Ordinance 21-14 First Reading with Emergency Provision

AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS, LICENSES AND APPROVAL FOR MARIJUANA CULTIVATION, PROCESSING AND/OR SALE OR SIMILAR BUSINESS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF DELTA AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY
