
Dear Greene County Career Center Adult Full Time Students,

As you are aware, these past few weeks have been challenging for everyone. You have not been able to be in your lab. We know that many of you have experienced some hardships during this time and we are excited to share that help is available.

On April 9th, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was signed into law. This act allows for additional funds to be made available to post-secondary students whose education and lives have been disrupted because of COVID-19. We have just received notification that these funds are now available for us to distribute. These funds may be used to help cover expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus including food, housing, course materials, technology, health care and child care. Please review the CARES Act Disbursement Form to determine your eligibility as well as your acceptance of these funds, if eligible. If you do not have a need at this time, you can refuse the funds. Each student must complete and submit the form, whether you are accepting these funds or not. Once you submit, a check will be mailed to the address listed within the next two weeks. **We must receive your response no later than Thursday, May 14, 2020.**

We are appreciative of the United State Department of Education's release of these funds for our students. It is critical that you continue to put forth your best performance during this time. Thank you for staying positive. Greene County Career Center is committed to finishing your program and assuring you receive the instruction that is critical to your learning.
