Dr. Anstadt provided updates on district events as the school year comes to a close.

Board Communication

Finance Committee- Mr. Hughes and Mr. Bannister attended the financial committee meeting with Mr. Fouke regarding the upcoming Five-Year Forecast, ESSER funds and the impact we are seeing financially. Mr. Bannister discussed the \$10 million dollar investment with Red Tree to increase our return from year to year, as well as the \$750,000 a year that will be set aside for the new middle school as we determine what will be needed for our portion (20%) of the construction cost.

<u>HR Committee</u>- Mrs. Garcia met with Mrs. Berryman regarding "Transfer Day." Mrs. Garcia mentioned the struggle districts locally and nationally are seeing regarding teacher shortages and commends Mrs. Berryman on the fabulous job she is doing.

<u>Legislative Updates</u> - Mrs. Mayfield provided the following information relating to the State Board of Education candidates being interviewed for the State Superintendent position; recently signed legislation by Governor DeWine - HB95, HB126, HB157, SB11, and SB135. Also discussed were recently introduced legislation - HB601, HB606, HB616, and SB318.
