Firefighters visit Washington Elementary

Mrs. Caldwell's kindergarten class and Mrs. Bennington's first grade class at Washington Elementary had an exciting visit by firefighters Greg Howard and Jordan Leasure from Station 13 Columbus Fire. Greg Howard is the grandfather of kindergartner Evelyn Ogle and first grader Brenna Ogle. During their visit, students were able to share what they already know about what to do during a fire emergency. Firefighter Greg reminded them to check their fire detectors and change the batteries, come up with a safe meeting place, and to memorize their home address in case they have to be the one to call 9-1-1.



One particular focus for this visit was for students to be aware of what a firefighter will look and sound like during a fire. This is important for the students to experience so that they won't be scared and hide in an emergency. Firefighter Jordan brought in all his gear and put it on for the students to see and even talked to them through his mask so students would know what they sound like. Students were encouraged to share what they learned about fire safety with their families at home!

Ms. Sharp led the students through a simulation activity to model how scientists determine water quality in streams and ponds. During the activity, students collected "debris" in their water sample and then applied mathematics skills to determine percentage of contaminants in the sample.
