Schools will be closed March 13 - April 3 per proclamation of Gov. Mike DeWine

On March 12, 2020, Governor DeWine announced that all schools in Ohio will be closed for three weeks. In response to this announcement, Logan Elm Schools will be closed from Friday, March 13th through Friday, April 3rd.

More information is available on our website (please click here for a direct link). We will continue to monitor this evolving situation, keeping the safety of our students and staff as our priority. We will provide updates via our district's webpage (loganelm.org); Twitter account (@loganelmschools) and our automated call system, One Call Now, if applicable.

We would like to remind you of the following recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends typical infectious disease precautions for COVID-19, just as those used to prevent cold or flu:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available.
- · Avoid touching your mouth, nose, or eyes.
- Cover coughs/sneezes with your arm or a tissue.
- Avoid exposure to others who are sick.
- Stay home if you are ill (except to visit a health care professional) and avoid close contact with others.
- Get adequate sleep and eat well-balanced meals to ensure a healthy immune system.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.




American Government Students Create Board Games


Jason Shepherd's American Government classes recently studied how a bill becomes a law. In order to demonstrate their new-found knowledge, the students created board games to highlight the process.

Mr. Shepherd said, "The "How a Bill becomes a Law" Board Game project/lesson took a total of 5 days. Students were given 4 days to design their board game by utilizing a guiding rubric that highlighted the lawmaking process both in the US House of Representatives and the Senate. Students were encouraged to not make their games easy to reflect the true nature of trying to get a bill passed into a law, which is extremely difficult. On the last day of the project, students worked through rotations to play each game. Students' games were evaluated through the use of a rubric. Students' games needed to have specific components/steps in the lawmaking process reflected in their games. Overall, the creativity, in-depth thought, and learning that students gained as well as displayed through their conversations while playing the games was simply awesome!"
