After the initial planning meeting, the next step in the process will be working with OFCC to advertise for, interview and hire an architect.

Mr. Mendenhall is a Chillicothe native and has a wealth of knowledge regarding planning, design and construction of new schools. Most recently, Mr. Mendenhall worked for Chillicothe City Schools during the construction of their new buildings. Prior to starting Mendenhall MCS and Associates, he worked for Ohio Facilities Construction Commission.
