Pickaway Manufacturing Day was held on October 7, 2022. With help from Pickaway Works and local education and business partners, high school students celebrated National Manufacturing Month and learned of career opportunities in our local area. DuPont, PPG, Kenworth, GE Industries, Health Care Logistics and MidWest Fabricating opened their doors to host groups of over 100 students and 10 chaperones from five area high schools.

Students were able to tour these facilities and learn first hand about in-demand, high paying careers in science, engineering, design, robotics, IT, sales, marketing, research and more. Students were served lunch where a presentation was provided by Pickaway-Ross on the various education options available to advance in the field of modern manufacturing. The last event of this kind was in 2019. College and Career Readiness Advisor, Brooke Summers, says Pickaway Works was "happy to be able to offer this valuable, in-person resource to Pickaway County students once again and highlight career opportunities right here in our area."

High school students/guardians also provide consent to be added in the random drug screening process as a way for these students to have personal accountability and an "out" if pressured by peers.

On September 19, several of our high students participated in a field trip to the inaugural "BE THE CHANGE" Youth Rally, hosted by the Pickaway Addiction Action Coalition. Our students had the opportunity to interact with peers from other Pickaway county schools, the National Guard, law enforcement and community behavioral health/substance abuse agencies, as well as actively engaging in a "YOUTH TO YOUTH" presentation by Ty Sells. This field trip provided games, a gift card drawing, bounce houses, a live DJ and lunch sponsored by community restaurants. Our students represented our district proudly!
