
Tonya Blubaugh, a school

### Aubree Walker



Last year was the first year for the overall 5-star rating scale. We are excited to learn that this year we earned a 4, which exceeds state standards.

### Specific areas we excelled in:

Progress ★★★☆☆

The district earned a 4 star in progress. This section reviews how much growth students are making each year.

#### Graduation ★★★★☆

The district earned a 4 star in the Graduation Component. This is a measure of the four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate and the five-year adjusted cohort graduation rate.

#### Gap Closing ★★★★



The Elementary school, specifically, earned a 5 star rating in the Gap Closing Component, which is a measure of the reduction in educational gaps for student subgroups. This rating significantly exceeds the state standards.
