**Our vision:** Logan Elm, in partnership with the community, will develop all students to become lifelong learners, engaged citizens, and leaders of tomorrow.

**District Initiatives and Activities** include showcasing student work in multiple platforms, supporting real-world problem-based learning, and collaborating with Pickaway WORKS initiatives to engage the community and local workforce.

**Career Awareness: Grades K-5**

Goal: Students become familiar with careers through learning that connects instruction to future work.

Strategies:

Show students various types of careers and stimulate interest in future work.

Interpersonal career skills are integrated into PBIS, curriculum, and are modeled by staff.

Problem-based learning is introduced.

Community members and “celebrity readers” work with classes, sharing about their careers.

Career discussions are integrated into lessons.

Growth Mindset is taught.

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**Career Exploration: Grades 6 – 8**

Goal: In addition to the continuation of the K-5 goal and strategies as appropriate, students explore career interests through embedded activities.

Strategies: Career exploration strategies are opportunities for students to discover work environments and understand various aspects of the workplace. Strategies include tools and instruments that help students understand and appreciate their strengths and interests. Students start plans for their future with career information and postsecondary education data, including course selection and planning as well as career aspirations and goals.

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**Career Planning: Grades 9 – 12**

Goal: In addition to the K-8 goals and strategies, students continue career exploration while focusing on career planning.

Students develop the skills to revisit previous exploration and planning strategies as they face career changes throughout life. Advanced experiences offer hands-on opportunities in a workplace or virtual work environment. Staff encourage participation in optional offerings and, as appropriate, offer incentives.
