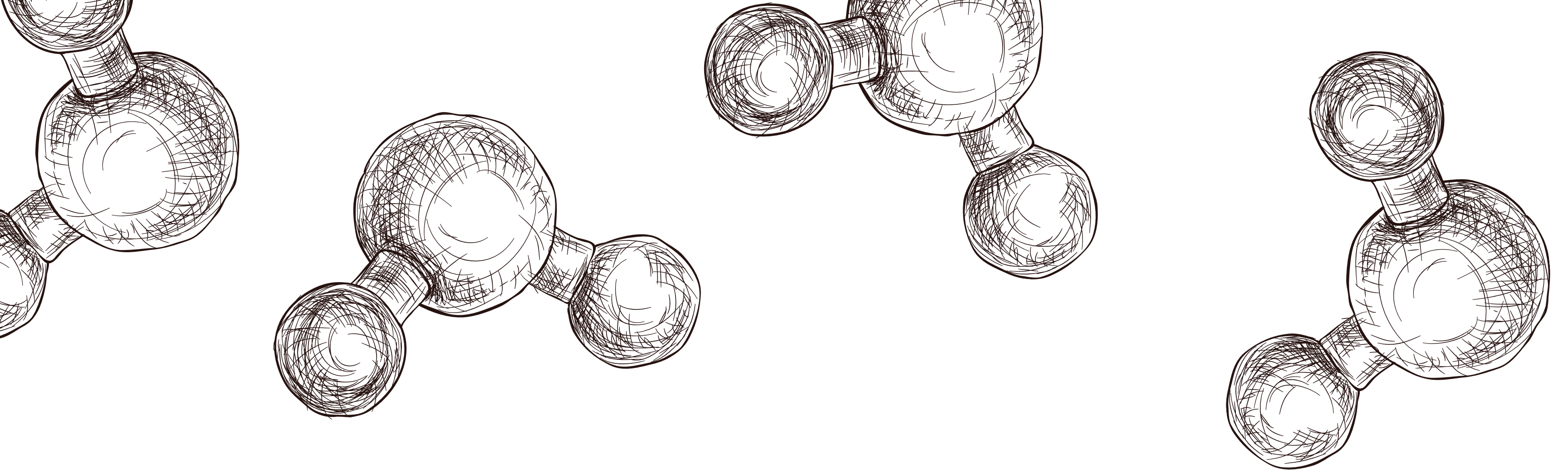

WELCOME TO CENTRAL DISTRICT SCIENCE DAY!

- **PARKING** in any Columbus State parking lot is fine. You must pay for parking. Visitors should follow signage directions to pay for hourly parking as needed, and park pulling in with rear license plate facing out. Visitors will pay \$2 per/hour for the first hour and \$1 per hour for each hour after. There will be a maximum of \$12.00/day. Visitors may register their license plates and pay for parking by using the Parking.com app or any of the methods available on the lot signage.
- **REGISTRATION** opens at 7:30 am and takes place on the first floor of Nestor Hall.
- **JUDGING** takes place from 9:00 am to approximately 11:00 am on the 2nd and 3rd floor of Nestor Hall (NH). NOTE: judging may be extended to 11:30 am. During judging, family and friends can hang out on the first floor of Nestor Hall or in the Union Cafe in Union Hall.
- **RE-JUDGING** occurs between 11:00 am and 11:30 am. Re-judging will be based on project display, abstract, and report materials only. STUDENTS NEED NOT BE PRESENT FOR RE-JUDGING.
- **FOOD** will be available for purchase at the Union Cafe and Starbucks in Union Hall from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm.
- **PROJECT BREAKDOWN** begins at 11:30 am. Students are asked to have their projects removed by 12:00 pm.
- **AWARDS CEREMONY** will begin at approximately 1:00 pm in Delaware Hall Room 121. Students eligible to go to State Science Day will be announced at the awards ceremony. School trophies will also be announced.
- **INTERNET ACCESS** is available using CSCC-Guest access. Log in through your device and accept the usage agreement. For IT help, contact the IT Help Desk (614-287-5050). Firefox is the recommended browser.

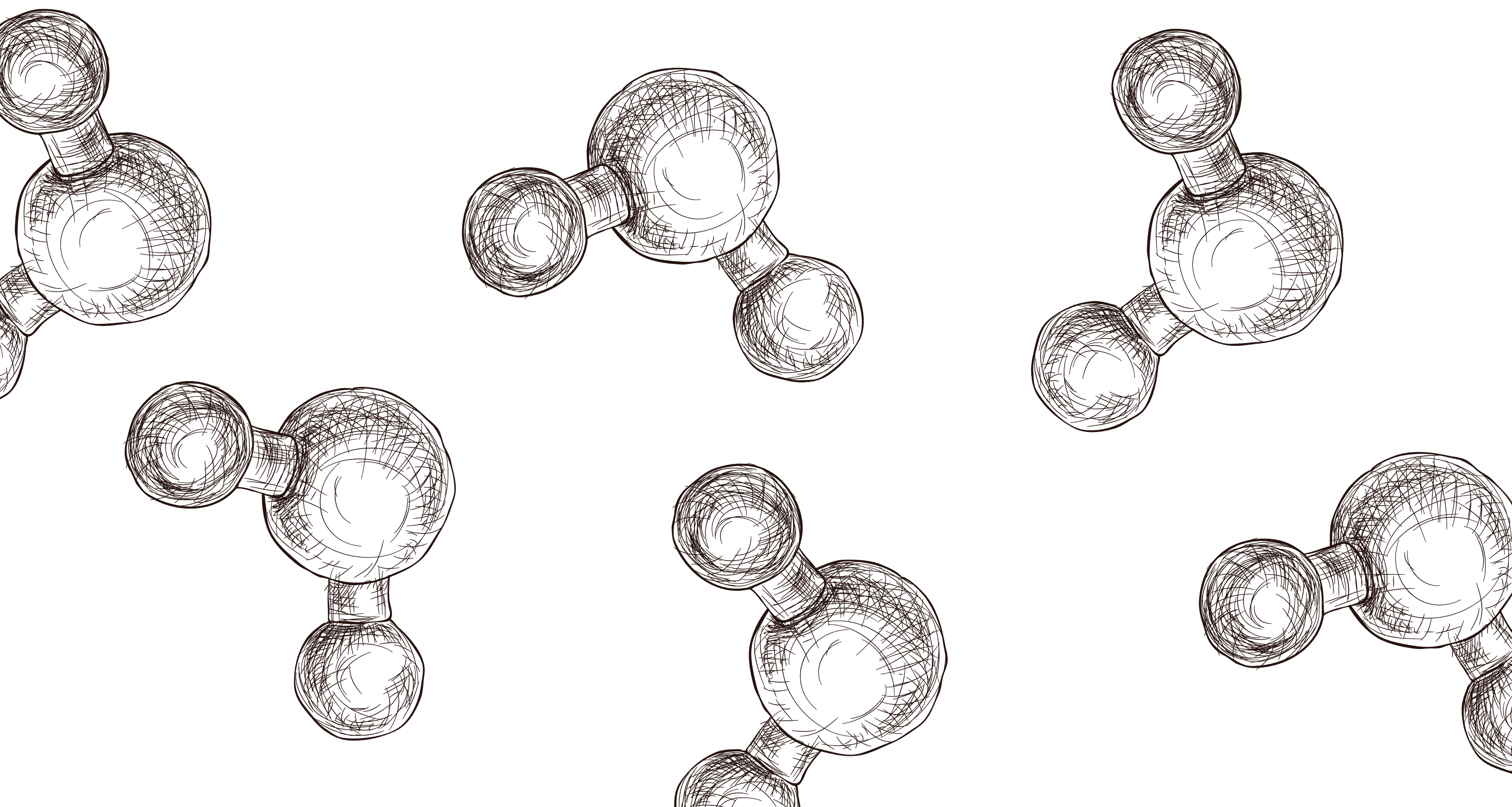
