SUMMER PROGRAMMING

In response to the challenges of this academic year, the district is preparing for a number of summer programming opportunities related to both academics and social-emotional learning. There will be **two programs** that may impact your child. Our **first** program will be an in-person, 'invite' only summer school that will occur in the mornings from late June through July. Transportation will be provided, and classes are morning only. Based on end of the year assessment data, those students who are identified as academically deficient in specific content areas will receive notice and are highly encouraged to enroll. Our **second** program will be open to any interested families. The format for this program will be digital, remote learning. NF will continue to update families as more specifics become available. There are also some 'third-party' summer programs that are shared in the various flyers below.



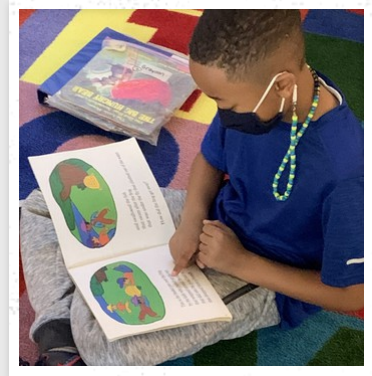

I am ready to go back to school when I am...

Released by my medical provider to return to school.	Evaluation by my doctor before returning to school
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If your child has strep throat or another bacterial infection, he/she should stay home until the antibiotic has been given for at least 24 hours and your health care provider has given permission for your child to return to school. We encourage you to seek medical attention when your child is sick and to follow your health care provider's recommendations about returning to school and other activities.
