DistanceLearning Plan Committee

After four weeks of closure and three weeks of Distance Learning, I am so impressed with the engagement, creativity, and flexibility being demonstrated by our students, families, and staff. I wish I could say that you will see us returning to "school" soon, but at this point all signs point to an extended closure. That means that our Distance Learning Plan is going to be our new "normal" for the foreseeable future.

Our initial Distance Learning Plan was developed and refined in response to the short term orders and guidance from the State of Illinois. With eight weeks of school ahead of us, we have convened a Distance Learning Committee comprised of teachers, administrators, support staff and parents to review and reflect on survey response data and to modify our plan as necessary.

Our goals for this crisis response include:

- Feed and care for the extended safety, health, and welfare of students, families, staff, and community at large.
- Communicate clearly; share coherent, organized and controlled messages with staff, students and community.
- Provide for the continuity of learning.
- Provide support and assistance to First Responders and Community as needed.

IMPORTANT UPDATES for Parents

As we prepare for the next 8 weeks of instruction, we have updated our plan and want to provide clarity on a few key items. For more detailed information, please review our updated documents:

PARENT EMPOWERMENT:

The purpose of our Distance Learning Plan is the continuation of student learning and to minimize and negative impact these unprecedented circumstances may have on students. We know that each family circumstance is unique and parents know what is best for their child and home. Please monitor stress level and work load. If you or your child become overwhelmed or stressed, PLEASE STOP. Students' grades will not be effected negatively during our Distance Learning Days.

Schedule:

Our Distance Learning Plan will continue through the month of April as scheduled. Teachers will continue to provide activities Monday through Friday so please be sure to remember to take attendance each day. However, for the next two Fridays (April 17th and 24th), teachers will NOT hold any live sessions and may not be available as they will be in planning meetings.

Attendance:

Please continue to take attendance DAILY so that we can monitor student engagement and activity.

Grading:

At the conclusion of the 3rd trimester or 4th quarter, students will be issued a letter grade of "P" for Pass or "I" for Incomplete. Final grades for art, music and physical education and other specials will also be issued as a "P" for Pass or "I" for Incomplete.

Distance Learning Grading Scale for Third Trimester for Grades K-8		
P = Pass	Pass: Students showed any evidence of learning or engagement during the distance learning timeframe. The mode of which a student provides evidence of learning needs to be differentiated based upon student circumstances.	
I = Incomplete	Incomplete: Students did not show any evidence of learning and will be given the opportunity to complete activities or assignments after distance learning ends.	

Workload:

The following guidelines for student engagement is inclusive of digital interaction as well as assigned work. This is <u>not</u> inclusive of enrichment opportunities, which ISBE encourages our teachers to provide. The table below could be inclusive of project time that spans multiple days, independent work, and direct teacher engagements.

Grade Level	Recommended Engagement Time*
Pre -K	60 minutes per day
Kindergarten	90 minutes per day
1st - 5th Grade	120 minutes per day
6th - 8th Grade	180 minutes per day

^{*}Please note that this chart reflects estimated engagement time in total for the day; however students are not required to work for 120 minutes straight. Parents can chunk the learning time based on their own knowledge and discretion regarding their child's individual attention span.
