The board approved the tax levy for 2019. As good stewards of the community trust, we establish the allowable taxing rate to be set to ensure sustained performance and maintenance of the District. Based on the projected Consumer Price Index, we anticipate an increase of 2.1% in District revenue.








# **Congrats to our D23 FLL Robotics Teams**


