

Transportation Enhancements Planned



Chief School Business Official, Mrs. Amy McPartlin, shared the planned enhancements for transportation services next year. Building upon the parameters set by the Board, we are working to implement a more consistent and parent/student friendly system of routing. Information will be shared this Spring in an effort to provide parents more time to prepare for the start of the next year.

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Ever Wonder about your child's Lunch Account Balance?

The Business Office has been working behind the scenes to enhance the features of the MealTime Lunch Program. Current student photos have been uploaded to the service terminals, providing an added layer of student identification for PIN lunch purchases and beginning January 15th, the District will be sending low balance reminders home via email!

Through the MealTime POS (Point of Sale software), we



now have the capability to push low and negative balance notifications out directly to families on a weekly basis. This automated feature will allow us to communicate with all families proactively and will replace the paper slips that have been sent home from some of the buildings. Low balance reminders will be sent once a student's lunch account falls below \$5. Parents will be reminded that it is time to make a deposit into their child's account.

We encourage all families to sign up for the MyMealTime account management tool. The link is available on the District website or by clicking: https://www.mymealtime.com/. The program allows parents the opportunity to check their student's balances, make online lunch deposits and track account activity and food purchases on a daily basis.
